## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 286-47, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

2 amended to read as follows:

4 ownership; containers. (a) Upon the registration of a vehicle,

16 be determined by the director of finance. If any of

	typographical error, the dealer, as defined in section
	437-1.1, shall notify the director of finance of the
	error by a written certificate stating the reasons for
	and nature of the error and the correction which
	should be made in the certificate of registration and
	the certificate of ownership. Upon receipt of the
	dealer's certificate by the director of finance, the
	certificate of registration and the certificate of
	ownership shall be corrected accordingly so long as
	the correction does not constitute a change of the
	vehicle originally registered. A fee shall be paid to
	the director of finance for each instance of
	correction of the registration records. The fee
	charged for each instance of correction of the
	registration records shall be established by the
	county's legislative body;

(2) In addition to the requirements provided for in paragraph (1) above, the face of the certificate of ownership shall contain endorsement lines for the transfer of title or interest of the registered owner and legal owner, and the odometer reading of the

1	vehicle on the date of transfer. The reverse side of
2	the certificate of ownership shall contain the
3	application for registration by the transferee $[+]$ .
4	[ <del>(3)(A)</del> ] (b) Every owner shall keep the certificate of
5	registration within the vehicle for which it is registered and
6	shall present the same at the request of a police officer, or in
7	the event the vehicle is a motorcycle, shall carry such
8	certificate in a convenient receptacle attached to the vehicle
9	and which shall be presented at the request of a police officer;
10	provided that this subsection shall not apply to:
11	[(B)] (1) [This shall not apply to state] State or
12	county vehicles readily identified by the license
13	plates and markings on sides of such vehicles;
14	[(C)] (2) [This shall not apply to commercial]
15	Commercial vehicles defined as rental motor vehicles,
16	or cars shipped by licensed car dealerships or
17	repossession companies. These businesses may keep a
18	duplicate copy of the certificate of registration
19	within the vehicle for which it is registered, in
20	which case the certificate of registration shall be

1		available for inspection at their principal place of

19	SECT	ION 2. Section 286-271, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
20	amended b	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:			

1 Except as provided in subsection (b), a legal owner of a vehicle shall not ship that vehicle interisland in this 2 State unless the legal owner first presents to the carrier the 3 4 legal owner's current certificate of registration showing that 5 the person is the registered owner of the vehicle, 6 identification, and proof of motor vehicle insurance. If the 7 registered owner of the vehicle is not the legal owner of the 8 vehicle, the registered owner shall present to the carrier, the 9 registered owner's current certificate of registration, 10 identification, and proof of motor vehicle insurance. Duplicate copies of the current registration and proof of motor vehicle 11 12 insurance shall be acceptable for commercial vehicles as defined in section [286-47(3)(C).] 286-47(b)(2). An authorized agent of **13** the legal or registered owner may ship the vehicle by presenting 14 15 the current certificate of registration, identification, proof 16 of motor vehicle insurance, and a notarized letter from the 17 registered or legal owner authorizing the shipment. For an 18 unrecorded owner pending a lawful transfer, a certificate of 19 ownership signed by the previous owner may be submitted for the 20 current certificate of registration for a vehicle purchased within thirty days of shipping. A facsimile of proof of motor 21

- 1 vehicle insurance from an insurance company may be accepted for
- 2 a vehicle purchased within thirty days of shipping.
- 3 Presentation of proof of motor vehicle insurance shall not be
- 4 required for:
- 5 (1) Unlicensed propelled vehicles that are not intended
- for on-road use;
- 7 (2) New unregistered vehicles shipped with a bill of
- 8 lading; or
- 9 (3) Vehicles owned by the federal, state, or county
- 10 government."
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 12 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 13 begun before its effective date.
- 14 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
