A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ELECTRIC VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 269, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part III to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§269- Electric vehicle rebate program; special fund.
5	(a) The public utilities commission, in consultation with
6	electric vehicle stakeholders and the state energy office, shall
7	administer the electric vehicle rebate program to incentivize
8	the purchase of new electric vehicles, as provided in this
9	section, and may contract with a third-party administrator
10	pursuant to section 269-73 to operate and manage the rebate
11	program.
12	(b) There is established within the state treasury the
13	electric vehicle rebate special fund into which shall be
14	deposited:
15	(1) The portion of the environmental response, energy, and
16	food security tax specified under section 243-3.5;
17	(2) Appropriations made by the legislature;



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1	(3)	Gifts, grants, and other public and private funds;
2	(4)	Any federal funds; and
3	(5)	All interest and revenue of receipts derived from the
4		fund.
5	(c)	Moneys in the electric vehicle rebate special fund
6	shall:	
7	(1)	Provide rebates for the acquisition of new electric
8		vehicles of an amount not to exceed \$2,000 per
9		electric vehicle; and
10	(2)	Pay for any administrative, operational, training, and
11		marketing costs associated with providing rebates from
12		the electric vehicle rebate special fund.
13	<u>(</u> d)	Applications for rebates shall be made to the public
14	utilities	commission and shall be for the acquisition of one or
15	more new	electric vehicles licensed and intended for use on
16	Hawaii's	highways; provided that the electric vehicles are:
17	(1)	Intended to be charged primarily by renewable energy
18		sources; or
19	(2)	Able to be integrated intelligently with the
20		electrical grid.



1	<u>(e)</u>	An applicant may be eligible for a rebate under the
2	electric	vehicle rebate program if the applicant:
3	(1)	Meets the specifications and requirements established
4		by the public utilities commission;
5	(2)	Files a completed application form, as prescribed by
6		the public utilities commission, together with all
7		supporting documentation required by the public
8		utilities commission;
9	(3)	Completes the purchase or lease, licensing, and
10		registration of one or more new electric vehicles,
11		prior to applying for one or more electric vehicle
12		rebates;
13	(4)	Provides any other information deemed necessary by the
14		public utilities commission; and
15	<u>(5)</u>	Meets any additional requirements as determined by the
16		public utilities commission.
17	<u>(f)</u>	Disbursements from the electric vehicle rebate special
18	fund shal	l not be subject to chapter 42F.
19	<u>(g)</u>	This section shall apply to new electric vehicles
20	purchased	l after July 1, 2020.



1	(h) Applicants shall submit applications to the public
2	utilities commission within twelve months of the date of
3	completion of the purchase or lease, licensing, and registration
4	of an applicable electric vehicle. Failure to apply to the
5	commission within twelve months shall constitute a waiver of the
6	right to claim the rebate.
7	(i) Nothing in this section shall alter the taxes due on
8	the original purchase of an electric vehicle prior to the
9	application of the rebate. Any rebate received pursuant to the
10	electric vehicle rebate program shall not be considered income
11	for the purposes of state or county taxes.
12	(j) The public utilities commission shall include
13	information on the electric vehicle rebate special fund and
14	statistical information on participation in the public utilities
15	commission's annual report to the governor pursuant to section
16	269-5.
17	(k) As used in this section:
18	"Electric vehicle" has the same meaning as contained in
19	Section 30D of the Internal Revenue Code for "new qualified
20	plug-in electric drive motor vehicle".



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1	"Integrated intelligently with the electrical grid" means		
2	that the demand of the electric vehicle for electricity from the		
3	grid is controlled to enable reduction of the vehicle's		
4	electrical demand on the grid during peak demand times and to		
5	enable maximum use of renewable energy sources, baseload energy		
6	sources, or renewable energy potentially available off peak that		
7	would otherwise be curtailed."		
8	SECTION 2. Section 243-3.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
9	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:		
10	"(a) In addition to any other taxes provided by law,		
11	subject to the exemptions set forth in section 243-7, there is		
12	hereby imposed a state environmental response, energy, and food		
13	security tax on each barrel or fractional part of a barrel of		
14	petroleum product sold by a distributor to any retail dealer or		
15	end user of petroleum product, other than a refiner. The tax		
16	shall be $[\frac{\$1.05}{2}]$ on each barrel or fractional part of a		
17	barrel of petroleum product that is not aviation fuel; provided		
18	that of the tax collected pursuant to this subsection:		
19	(1) 5 cents of the tax on each barrel shall be deposited		
20	into the environmental response revolving fund		
21	established under section 128D-2;		

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1	(2)	5 cents of the tax on each barrel shall be deposited
2		into the energy security special fund established
3		under section 201-12.8;
4	(3)	10 cents of the tax on each barrel shall be deposited
5		into the energy systems development special fund
6		established under section 304A-2169.1; [and]
7	(4)	15 cents of the tax on each barrel shall be deposited
8		into the agricultural development and food security
9		special fund established under section 141-10[-]; and
10	(5)	cents of the tax on each barrel shall be deposited
11		into the electric vehicle rebate special fund
12		established under section 269
13	The	tax imposed by this subsection shall be paid by the
14	distribut	or of the petroleum product."
15	SECT	ION 3. Section 269-73, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16	amended t	o read as follows:
17	"[+]	<pre>§269-73[+] Electric vehicle charging system; new</pre>
18	electric	vehicle; rebate program; administrator; establishment.
19	(a) The	public utilities commission may contract with a third-
20	party adm	inistrator to operate and manage any programs
21	establish	ed under section $269-72[-]$ or $269-$. The



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1 administrator shall not be deemed to be a "governmental body" as 2 defined in section 103D-104; provided that all moneys 3 transferred to the third-party administrator shall have been 4 appropriated by the legislature or shall be from funds provided 5 by the federal government or private funding sources. The 6 administrator shall not expend more than ten per cent of the 7 amounts appropriated for the rebate [program] programs or other 8 reasonable percentage determined by the public utilities 9 commission for administration of the programs established under 10 section 269-72[-] or 269- .

11 The electric vehicle charging system rebate program (b) 12 administrator and the electric vehicle rebate program 13 administrator shall be subject to regulation by the public 14 utilities commission under any provision applicable to a public 15 utility in sections 269-7, 269-8, 269-8.2, 269-8.5, 269-9, 16 269-10, 269-13, 269-15, 269-19.5, and 269-28, and shall report 17 to the public utilities commission on a regular basis. 18 Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the 19 electric vehicle charging system rebate program administrator 20 and the electric vehicle rebate program administrator shall not



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be an electric public utility or an electric public utility
 affiliate."

3 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the electric
4 vehicle rebate special fund the sum of \$ or so much
5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for the
6 electric vehicle rebate program.

7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the public8 utilities commission for the purposes of this Act.

9 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

11 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2020.
