A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO GRANTS FOR LOCAL RECYCLING FACILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii has grappled
- 2 with solutions to deal with municipal waste for decades.
- 3 Landfill capacity is rapidly decreasing, even after creating
- 4 mitigation measures like exportation and incineration.
- 5 Currently, the vast majority of recyclable materials are
- 6 recycled outside the State. Landfill diversion has global
- environmental benefits, including reducing the need to extract 7
- 8 raw materials from mines, such as aluminum, and decreasing the
- 9 amount of methane gas released into the atmosphere as waste
- 10 decomposes. Landfills are the third largest source of methane
- 11 emissions in the United States behind industry and agricultural
- 12 sources. According to the United States Environmental
- 13 Protection Agency, methane is the second most prevalent
- 14 greenhouse gas emitted in the United States from human
- 15 activities, which has a significant impact on climate change.
- 16 The legislature further finds that an investment in local
- recycling facilities is immediately necessary to address the 17



- 1 human impact on Hawaii's natural environment and mitigate the
- 2 effects of the climate crisis.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to support recycling,
- 4 bioconversion, or composting businesses within the State of
- 5 Hawaii.
- 6 SECTION 2. Chapter 342G, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended by adding a new section to part V to be appropriately
- 8 designated and to read as follows:
- 9 "§342G- Recycling facility grant program. (a) There
- 10 is established in the office a recycling facility grant program
- 11 to be administered by the department. The department shall
- 12 issue grants to recycling facility operators to assist them in
- 13 offsetting the costs of operations within the State.
- 14 (b) Grant program funds shall be disbursed from the
- 15 environmental management special fund established under section
- 16 342G-63 to the recycling facility operator for up to \$750,000.
- 17 (c) Any recycling facility operator requesting a grant
- 18 shall:
- 19 (1) Be licensed and accredited, as applicable, under the
- laws of the State;

1	(2)	Submit its request together with all the information
2		required by the director on an application form
3		provided by the department;
4	(3)	Comply with all applicable federal and state laws
5		prohibiting discrimination against any person on the
6		basis of race, color, national origin, religion,
7		creed, sex, age, sexual orientation, disability, or
8		any other characteristic protected under applicable
9		federal or state law;
10	(4)	Not use the grant for purposes of entertainment or
11		perquisites;
12	<u>(5)</u>	Comply with any other requirements the director may
13		prescribe;
14	(6)	Provide the director, the legislative bodies, and the
15		auditor with full access to records, reports, files,
16		and other related documents so that the program,
17		management, and fiscal practices of the grant
18		recipient may be monitored and evaluated to assure the
19		proper and effective expenditure of public funds; and
20	<u>(7)</u>	Be monitored according to rules established by the
21		director to ensure compliance with this section.

I	<u>(d)</u>	Any recipient of a grant under this section who	
2	withholds	or omits any material fact or deliberately	
3	misrepres	ents facts to the director or who violates the terms of	
4	the recip	ient's contract shall be in violation of this section	
5	and, in addition to any other penalties provided by law, shall		
6	be prohibited from applying for a grant under this section for		
7	period of	five years from the date of termination."	
8	SECT	ION 3. Section 342G-14, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
9	amended to read as follows:		
10	" [-[]	§342G-14[+] Powers and duties of the office of solid	
11	waste man	agement. The office shall:	
12	(1)	Promote the development of coordinated statewide solid	
13		waste management;	
14	(2)	Identify and monitor environmental and public health	
15		issues relating to solid waste management;	
16	(3)	Promote source reduction, recycling, and	
17		bioconversion, including home composting, through the	
18		provision of a comprehensive, innovative, and	
19		effective statewide public education and awareness	
20		program concerning the value of source reduction and	

1		recycling, and the way the public can participate in
2		these areas;
3	(4)	Comply with the federal Resource Conservation and
4		Recovery Act of 1976 (42 United States Code section
5		6901 et seq.) and any other federal law heretofore or
6		hereafter enacted affecting solid waste;
7	(5)	Seek compliance with sections 226-18, 226-52, and 226-
8		103;
9	(6)	Assess the feasibility of employing disposal fees,
10		including fees at the point of introduction or sale of
11		any product that would require eventual disposition as
12		solid waste, as possible funding sources for waste
13		management activities;
14	(7)	Coordinate with the department of land and natural
15		resources to incorporate solid waste management and
16		processing concerns in the department of land and
17		natural resources' land use planning and development
18		efforts;
19	(8)	Coordinate the bioconversion efforts of appropriate
20		agency and county activities, including the provision

1		of technical assistance and the evaluation of
2		bioconversion programs;
3	(9)	Provide waste evaluation services and assistance in
4		developing paper recycling and other materials
5		programs to both the public and private sector, where
6		feasible;
7	(10)	Promote the use of enterprise zones in each county to
8		support source reduction, recycling, and
9		bioconversion-type businesses;
10	(11)	Establish a recycling facility grant program to
11		incentivize reduction, recycling, bioconversion, or
12		composting businesses in the State;
13	[(11)]	(12) Create and maintain a database to assess the
14		composition of the State's waste stream. If feasible,
15	•	this database shall contain the information necessary
16		to generate the office's annual report;
17	[(12)]	(13) Identify and apply for appropriate federal funds
18		to support the programs and activities authorized by
19		this chapter; and

1	[(13)]	(14) Cooperate with appropriate federal, state, and
2		county agencies in carrying out the office's
3		responsibilities under this chapter."
4	SECT	ION 4. Section 342G-63, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by	y amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
6	"(C)	The department shall expend moneys contained in the
7	environme	ntal management special fund to:
8	(1)	Partially fund the operating costs of the program
9		including its regulatory functions and the development
10		of waste reduction and diversion activities as
11		mandated by chapter 342G;
12	(2)	Fund statewide education, demonstration, and market
13		development programs, through direct contract or
14		direct transfer of funds to the counties and the
15		department of business, economic development, and
16		tourism, or under a grant program that may be
17		developed under rules pursuant to chapter 91; [and]
18	(3)	Provide for annual training for municipal solid waste
19		operators in compliance with 40 Code of Federal
20		Regulations Part 258 and chapter 11-58, Hawaii
21		Administrative Rules[-]; and

- 1 (4) Award grants pursuant to section 342G- ."
- 2 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 3 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 4 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 to be
- 5 deposited into the environmental management special fund.
- 6 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the environmental
- 7 management special fund the sum of \$ or so much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2020-2021 for the
- 9 implementation of the recycling facility grant program pursuant
- 10 to this Act, including one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE)
- 11 contract specialist position.
- 12 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 13 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 14 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 16 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
