A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MASSAGE THERAPISTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the practice of
massage therapy in the State affects public health and safety.
As a matter of public interest and concern, massage therapist
licensees should regularly maintain their knowledge and
education and receive basic first aid and emergency-related
training through mandatory continuing education requirements.

7 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require massage 8 therapist licensees, beginning with the renewal for the 9 licensing biennium commencing on July 1, 2024, and every 10 biennial renewal thereafter, to complete twelve hours of 11 continuing education within the two-year period preceding the 12 renewal date, of which two hours shall include first aid, 13 cardiopulmonary resuscitation, or other emergency-related 14 course.

15 SECTION 2. Section 452-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 16 amended to read as follows:

1 establishment licenses shall expire on June 30 of each evennumbered year following the date of issuance unless renewed for 2 3 the next biennium. These licenses may be renewed by filing an 4 application therefor, accompanied by a renewal fee [-,] and submitting proof of compliance with the continuing education 5 6 requirements established by subsection (b). The application 7 shall be made between May 1 and June 30 of each even-numbered 8 year. Failure to apply for renewal as provided in this section shall constitute a forfeiture of the license as of the date of 9 expiration. Any license so forfeited may be restored within one 10 11 year after expiration upon the filing of an application in the 12 same manner, submitting proof of compliance with the continuing 13 education requirements established by subsection (b), and 14 payment of a penalty fee in addition to all delinquent fees. Thereafter, the person shall apply as a new applicant and the 15 16 board may require the person to take and pass the examination 17 and satisfy all requirements for the examination, including training, if the board is not satisfied that the person 18 19 possesses current knowledge and skills for the practice of 20 massage therapy.
