A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREARMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature notes that Act 74, Session Laws
- 2 of Hawaii 2020, established, among other things, the class C
- 3 felony offense of manufacturing, purchasing, or obtaining
- 4 firearm parts to assemble a firearm having no serial number.
- 5 This offense is now codified in section 134-10.2, Hawaii Revised
- 6 Statutes. However, according to law enforcement agencies,
- 7 persons found to be in possession of firearms having no serial
- 8 number, which are also known as "ghost guns" because they are
- 9 untraceable, claim that their actions do not violate the law
- 10 because the parts used to assemble the firearm were acquired
- 11 before the September 15, 2020, effective date of
- 12 section 134-10.2, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
- 14 (1) Amend the offense of manufacturing, purchasing, or
- obtaining firearm parts to assemble a firearm having
- no serial number to also prohibit possession of those
- firearm parts; and

1	(2) Amend Act 74, Session Laws of Hawaii 2020, to repeal
2	language that specified the prospective application of
3	that Act.
4	SECTION 2. Section 134-10.2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
6	"(a) A person who is not licensed to manufacture a firearm
7	under section 134-31, or who is not a dealer licensed by the
8	United States Department of Justice, shall not, for the purpose
9	of assembling a firearm, possess, purchase, produce with a
10	three-dimensional printer, or otherwise obtain separately, or as
11	part of a kit:
12	(1) A firearm receiver that is not imprinted with a serial
13	number registered with a federally licensed
14	manufacturer;
15	(2) A firearm receiver that has not been provided a serial
16	number that may be registered in accordance with
17	section 134-3(c); or
18	(3) Any combination of parts from which a firearm having
19	no serial number may be readily assembled; provided
20	that the parts do not have the capacity to function as
21	a firearm unless assembled."

- 1 SECTION 3. Act 74, Session Laws of Hawaii 2020, is amended
- 2 by repealing section 6.
- 3 ["SECTION 6. This Act does not affect rights and duties
- 4 that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that
- 5 were begun before its effective date."]
- 6 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2022.
