A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the use of cover 2 crops and green manure increases agricultural productivity and 3 aligns with the State's integrated sustainability goals. Plants 4 used for this purpose, including grasses, legumes, and forbs, 5 add nutrients to the soil, act as windbreaks, assist with water 6 retention, provide habitats for beneficial insects, and help to 7 prevent soil erosion.

8 The legislature further finds that it is in the interest of 9 the State to incentivize the use of management practices that 10 enhance the quality and sustainability of Hawaii's agricultural 11 lands.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish and appropriate moneys for a crop reimbursement pilot program to reimburse farming operations in the State for the costs of acquiring cover crop seeds or green manure.

16 SECTION 2. (a) The department of agriculture shall17 establish and implement a three-year crop reimbursement pilot



1 program to reimburse farming operations in the State for the 2 costs of acquiring cover crop seeds or green manure. 3 Applications for cost reimbursements shall be (b) 4 submitted on a form furnished by the department of agriculture 5 and shall be accompanied by documentation of the costs of 6 purchase, pursuant to subsection (c); provided that: 7 (1)The applicant shall indemnify and hold harmless the 8 State and its officers, agents, and employees from all 9 claims arising out of or resulting from the cover crop 10 seeds or green manure purchased; and 11 (2) The department of agriculture may request that an 12 applicant provide additional information for the 13 purposes of verifying the volume of cover crop or 14 green manure purchased. 15 (C) Applications for reimbursement under the crop 16 reimbursement pilot program shall be filed for seeds purchased 17 within the fiscal year immediately preceding the filing and be 18 effective for costs of purchasing cover crops or green manure 19 incurred after June 30, 2021, and before July 1, 2024. The 20 documentation shall include a certification that the amount for 21 which the applicant seeks reimbursement is not already covered



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by other governmental cover crop incentive programs, including
 the National Resource Conservation Service's environmental
 quality incentive payment program or the conservation
 stewardship program.

(d) Funds shall be dispersed upon approval on an annual
basis by the department of agriculture to the farmer or rancher
for up to seventy-five per cent of the costs incurred for cover
crop seeds or green manure purchased after June 30, 2021, and
before July 1, 2024.

10 (e) The department shall convene a review panel comprising 11 of knowledgeable representatives from the department, college of tropical agriculture and human resources, and industry 12 13 organizations to screen and rate applicants on the quality and 14 appropriate use of their cover crops and green manure practices. 15 The department shall aggregate the total reimbursement 16 applications pursuant to this section and distribute the 17 available moneys on a ranking scale from highest to lowest as 18 determined by the review panel.

19 (f) There is established within the department of
20 agriculture a cover crop reimbursement pilot program manager
21 position, which shall be a full-time temporary position exempt

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1 from chapters 76 and 89, Hawaii Revised Statutes. The cover 2 crop reimbursement pilot program manager shall receive a salary not to exceed \$50,000 per year. The cover crop reimbursement 3 4 pilot program manager shall possess a requisite level of 5 knowledge and expertise in the area of program management 6 necessary to carry out the duties of the position. The cover 7 crop pilot reimbursement program manager shall: 8 Facilitate the division and distribution of available (1)9 costs for reimbursement; and 10 (2) Manage the day-to-day coordination of the cover crop 11 reimbursement pilot program. Any action taken by the department of agriculture 12 (q) 13 pursuant to this section shall be exempt from the rulemaking requirements of chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 14 15 The department of agriculture shall submit a report of (h) its findings and recommendations, including any proposed 16 17 legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior 18 to the convening of the regular session of 2025. The report 19 shall include the department's recommendation on whether the 20 pilot program should be extended, with or without modifications. 21 (i) As used in this section:

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1 "Cover crop" and "green manure" mean the plants listed in
2 the cover crop and green manure database maintained by the
3 university of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human
4 resources.

5 "Farming operation" has the same meaning as defined in6 section 165-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

7 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,000,000 or so much 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2021-2022 and the 10 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 11 2022-2023 for the department of agriculture to establish, 12 implement, and administer a cover crop reimbursement pilot 13 program; provided that up to \$20,000 may be used for 14 administrative costs.

15 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department16 of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.

17 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2021.

Sustainable Agriculture; Cover Crop Reimbursement Pilot Program; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes a cover crop reimbursement pilot program to provide up to seventy-five per cent cost reimbursement to farming operations in the State for acquiring cover crop seeds or green manure. Requires the convening of a review panel to screen and rate applicants on the quality of their cover crop and green manure practices. Establishes a cover crop reimbursement pilot program manager position within the department of agriculture to administer the program. Requires a report to the legislature. Appropriates funds. (SD1)
