## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DECEPTIVE TRADE PRACTICES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii residents are
- 2 often barred from claiming offers for free or reduced rate
- 3 shipping, which are more commonly available to purchasers in
- 4 other states. Many retailers also apply an arbitrary shipping
- 5 cost to Hawaii residents, which does not correlate with the
- 6 actual cost of shipping.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to establish that charging
- 8 shipping and delivery charges that exceed the actual cost to
- 9 ship or deliver a commodity to a consumer in the State shall
- 10 constitute an unfair and deceptive practice.
- 11 SECTION 2. Chapter 481B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 13 and to read as follows:
- 14 "\$481B- Shipping charges. In the sale or purchase of
- 15 any commodity to be shipped or delivered to a consumer in the
- 16 State, if a separate charge for shipping or delivery is charged

- 1 to a consumer, that charge shall not exceed the actual cost to
- 2 ship or deliver the commodity to a consumer in the State."
- 3 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 4 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.

Deceptive Trade Practices; Shipping Charges; Delivery Charges; Commodities

Establishes that charging shipping and delivery charges that exceed the actual cost to ship or deliver a commodity to a consumer in Hawaii constitutes an unfair and deceptive practice. Effective 1/1/2050. (HD2)
