## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to subpart C of part IV to be
3	appropria	tely designated and to read as follows:

5	The acade	mic plan for each school required under
6	section 3	02A-1124 shall include:
7	(1)	Under the measurable outcomes section of the plan, a
8		clear accounting of all resources that will be
9		allocated to address and achieve each measurable
10		outcome; provided that the accounting shall include a
11		breakdown of costs, funding sources for those costs,
12		and full-time employee positions, or fractions
13		thereof, designated to achieve the measurable outcome;
14	(2)	Under the educational outcomes section of the plan, a
15		clear description of the school's priority improvement
16		strategies and measures to determine progress;

1	<u>(3)</u>	Student growth indicators, which may include but not
2		be limited to the school's National Assessment of
3		Educational Progress assessment scores and authentic
4		assessment results;
5	(4)	Information about programs intended to address social
6		and economic conditions that adversely impact student
7		<pre>learning;</pre>
8	(5)	A breakdown of teacher vacancy data, including:
9		(A) The number of positions filled by an unlicensed
10		teacher throughout the school year;
11		(B) The number of positions not filled by a licensed
12		teacher at any point during the school year; and
13		(C) The number of positions filled by a teacher who
14		is working outside of their field of educational
15		<pre>expertise;</pre>
16	<u>(6)</u>	The average class size for all regular education,
17		special education, and content-based English-language
18		learning classes, including any plans to reduce class
19		sizes; and
20	<u>(7)</u>	Any other information contained in the school's status
21		improvement report deemed relevant for academic and

1		financial planning purposes, including the number of	
2		teachers with advanced degrees, number of teachers	
3		with five or more years of teaching experience at the	
4		school, and average number of years of teaching	
5		experience of the school's teacher workforce.	
6	(b)	The department shall submit to the legislature and the	
7	board a r	eport on the academic and financial plan of each school	
8	grouped b	y complex area no later than twenty days prior to the	
9	convening of each regular session.		
10	(c)	For the purposes of this section, "authentic	
11	assessmen	t" means an evaluation of student performance that	
12	involves	multiple forms of measurement other than standardized	
13	testing a	nd that connects instructional content to real-world	
14	problem-s	olving, including but not limited to project-based	
15	learning and problem-based learning."		
16	SECT	ION 2. New statutory material is underscored.	
17	SECT	ION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2021.	

## Report Title:

Education; DOE; Academic and Financial Plan; Report

## Description:

Requires each school's academic plan to include a clear accounting of all resources that will be allocated to address and achieve each measurable outcome; the school's priority improvement strategies and measures to determine progress; student growth indicators; information about programs intended to address social and economic conditions that adversely impact student learning; a breakdown of certain teacher vacancy data; average class sizes for all regular education, special education, and content-based English-language learning classes; and teacher workforce experience metrics. Requires the department of education to submit an annual report on the school academic and financial plans to the board of education and the legislature. (HD2)
