A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BULLYING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
3	to read as follows:
4	"PART
5	BULLYING PREVENTION AND RESPONSE ACTION PLAN
6	§302A- Bullying prevention and response action plan.
7	(a) The board shall develop a bullying prevention and response
8	action plan to inform public school students, public school
9	employees or volunteers, and department employees or volunteers
10	of policies and procedures for:
11	(1) The prevention of and education regarding bullying,
12	harassment, and retaliation in the department and in
13	public schools;
14	(2) Reporting bullying and harassment to the department,
15	board, or law enforcement agencies, as appropriate;

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1 Reporting bullying or harassment to the parents of the (3) 2 public school students who committed or were affected by bullying or harassment; 3 4 (4) The investigation of alleged bullying or harassment by the department if the alleged bullying or harassment 5 occurred in a public school or by the board if the 6 7 alleged bullying or harassment occurred in the 8 department; 9 (5)Preserving and documenting evidence of bullying and 10 harassment in the department or public schools; 11 (6) Engaging in mediation, non-punitive response, or other 12 alternative dispute resolution for conduct occurring 13 between public school students, employees, or volunteers of equal power; provided that no public 14 15 school student, employee, or volunteer shall be 16 required to accept mediation, non-punitive response, 17 or other alternative dispute resolution in lieu of 18 reporting to law enforcement agencies if the act or 19 conduct may be reasonably construed to constitute 20 bullying or harassment;

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(7) The referral, if appropriate, of public school
 students, public school employees or volunteers, or
 department employees or volunteers to outside
 resources or counseling services to remedy any mental
 health, social, or family challenges that arise from
 harassment or bullying; and

7 (8) An appeal process for any party not satisfied with the
8 outcome of the department's or board's investigation
9 or response.

10 (b) The board shall establish requirements for the 11 department to report to the board on the department's compliance 12 with any board policies, administrative rules, or applicable 13 statutes governing bullying and harassment and shall monitor the 14 department's compliance.

(c) The board shall review and update the bullying prevention and response action plan every twenty-four months to reflect electronic and technological changes and incorporate best practices in bullying prevention, education, investigation, reporting, and resolution.

2	including	any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later
3	than twen	ty days prior to the convening of each regular session

5	The repor	t shall redact any names or other identifying
6	informati	on that would identify any individual involved in any
7	alleged i	ncident of bullying or harassment. For each alleged
8	incident	of bullying or harassment, the report shall include:
9	(1)	A brief description of each act or conduct included in
10		the incident;
11	(2)	The date on which, or date range during which, the
12		incident occurred;
13	(3)	The date on which the incident was reported to the
14		department or board;
15	(4)	The status of the investigation by the department or
16		board into the incident, as of the date of the report;
17	(5)	The disposition of the investigation, as of the date
18		of the report;
19	(6)	The number of days elapsed between the date on which
20		the incident was reported to the department or board
21		and the implementation of its response, if any;

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(7)	Identification of the public school associated with
	the incident;
(8)	The disposition of any incident that was not
	identified as resolved in the prior annual report to
	the legislature; and
(9)	Any other information the board or department deems
	pertinent; provided that in no case shall the report
	include any name, identifying number, or other
	identifying information of any individual involved in
	an alleged incident of bullying or harassment that
	will identify the affected parties."

15	similar electronic	device that has the capability of sending and
16	receiving data.	
17	"Harassment" m	eans the act of bullying, annoying, or
18	alarming a public s	chool student, public school employee or
19	volunteer, or depar	tment employee or volunteer by engaging in
20	conduct that includ	es but is not limited to:

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1	(1)	Striking, shoving, kicking, or otherwise touching a
2		person in an offensive manner or subjecting the person
3		to offensive physical contact;
4	(2)	Insulting, taunting, or challenging another person in
5		a manner likely to provoke a violent response;
6	(3)	Making verbal or nonverbal expressions that cause
7		another person to feel uncomfortable, pressured,
8		threatened, or in danger because of reasons that
9		include but are not limited to the person's race;
10		color; national origin; ancestry; sex, including
11		gender identity and expression; religion; disability;
12		or sexual orientation; and that:
13		(A) Create an intimidating, hostile, or offensive
14		educational environment, or interferes with the
15		education of a student; or
16		(B) Otherwise adversely affect the educational
17		opportunity of a student or students;
18	(4)	Name calling, making rude gestures, insults, or
19		teasing that causes another person to feel humiliated,

10		facilities, services, or grounds, including restroom
11		facilities; or
12	(8)	Physically harming, physically restraining,
13		threatening, or stalking another person."
