SECTION 1. Section 286-106, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

Every driver's license 4 issued under this part, except for a provisional license issued 5 under section 286-102.6 [which] that shall expire on the date of 6 the provisional licensee's nineteenth birthday, whether an 7 original issuance or a renewal, shall expire on the first 8 birthday of the licensee occurring [not] no less than eight 9 years after the date of the issuance of the license, unless 10 sooner revoked or suspended; provided that:

11 (1) The license shall expire on the first birthday of the 12 licensee occurring [not] no less than four years after 13 the date of the issuance if, at the time, the licensee 14 is [twenty-four]:

15 (A) <u>Twenty-four</u> years of age or younger; <u>or</u>

16 (B) Seventy-two years of age or older but younger
