RELATING TO DATA ABOUT SNORKELS AND MASKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTI	ON 1. This Act shall be known and may be cited as the
2	"David Loa	asby Law".
3	SECTI	ION 2. The legislature finds that, according to the
4	Hawaii tou	rism authority's snorkel safety study, which was
5	conducted	from August 2017 to April 2021 under the
6	administra	ation of the Hawaiian Lifeguard Association, a
7	nonprofit	organization that promotes ocean safety and drowning
8	preventior	n efforts in the Hawaiian islands:
9	(1)	Drowning is the leading cause of injury-related death
10		among visitors to Hawaii;
11	(2)	Snorkeling is the most common activity associated with
12		visitor drownings;
13	(3)	These types of incidents have been increasing in
14		recent years; and
15	(4)	Due to a lack of evidence, it is difficult for
16		researchers to determine whether the type of snorkel
17		or mask worn increases the risk of drowning.

1 The legislature further finds that first responders in Maui 2 county have begun to record the type of face mask worn during 3 incidents involving snorkeling. However, not all counties 4 record and collect this important information. Recording 5 standardized, empirical data about the type of snorkel and mask 6 used, if any, will help demonstrate whether certain types of 7 snorkels or masks lead to a higher risk of drowning. The 8 legislature also finds that the safety of visitors and residents 9 is of statewide concern and that this standardized, empirical 10 data may create the opportunity to make well-informed policy changes to decrease the number of snorkeling deaths in the 11 12 State.

13 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to require first 14 responders to record in the incident report for each water 15 rescue event the type of snorkel and mask, if any, worn by the 16 person who was rescued or recovered.

SECTION 3. Chapter 46, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
read as follows:

20 "<u>§46-</u> Water rescue events; incident reports; snorkels 21 and masks. (a) For all water rescue events, the first

4	(b) As used in this section, "first responder" means:		
5	(1) Any employee of an emergency services provider who is		
6	engaged in providing firefighting, ocean safety, or		
7	emergency medical services;		
8	(2) A police officer; or		
9	(3) Law enforcement personnel of the department of land		
10	and natural resources."		
11	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general		
12	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$100,000 or so much		
13	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the		
14	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year		
15	2024-2025 for the department of health to update the reporting		
16	technology used in the statewide emergency medical services		
17	system for the purposes of this Act.		
18	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department		
19	of health for the purposes of this Act.		
20	SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.
