
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CANCER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the university of
2 Hawaii cancer center is one of seventy-one National Cancer
3 Institute-designated cancer centers in the United States. It is
4 the only center in Hawaii and the Pacific region. The
5 legislature also finds that the university of Hawaii cancer
6 center reduces the burden of cancer through research, education,
7 patient care, and community outreach with an emphasis on the
8 unique ethnic, cultural, and environmental characteristics of
9 Hawaii and the Pacific region.

10 Cancer incidence and mortality rates have decreased in
11 Hawaii over the last decade, but despite this overall reduction,
12 the disparities between ethnic populations continue to be of
13 concern. Native Hawaiians continue to have the highest cancer
14 incidence and mortality rates among men and women, and also have
15 higher incidences of breast and ovarian cancers. Similarly,
16 Filipino women have the highest incidences of ovarian and
17 thyroid cancer. The legislature finds that cancer research



1 focusing on Native Hawaiians, Pacific Islanders, and Filipinos
2 is unique to Hawaii and the university of Hawaii cancer center
3 and thus cannot be easily conducted anywhere else in the world.

4 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the
5 university of Hawaii cancer center for a multi-ethnic cohort
6 study focusing on the social determinants of health, lifestyles,
7 environmental exposures, and resilience factors of Native
8 Hawaiians, Pacific Islanders, and Filipinos.

9 SECTION 2. (a) There is appropriated out of the general
10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
11 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
12 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
13 year 2024-2025 for a multi-ethnic cohort study focusing on the
14 social determinants of health, lifestyles, environmental
15 exposures, and resilience factors of Native Hawaiians, Pacific
16 Islanders, and Filipinos.

17 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the university
18 of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

19 (b) The university of Hawaii cancer center shall seek
20 federal funding, in addition to the funds appropriated by this
21 Act, to complete the multi-cohort study.


