A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PRESCRIPTION DRUGS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that prescription drugs 2 may not be dispensed unless the label of the container 3 identifies the drug prescribed and provides other specific 4 information that is considered essential for public health and 5 safety. Nonetheless, individuals may often have difficulty reading the labels on the prescription drug containers due to 6 7 disability or age, including persons with low vision or 8 blindness. Difficulty in reading the labels on prescription 9 drug containers may affect as many as sixty thousand residents 10 in the State. The legislature further finds that certain 11 technology provides the prescription drug label information in 12 alternate formats that are more accessible to persons who have 13 difficulty seeing or reading standard printed labels on 14 prescription drug containers.

15 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:

16 (1) Require pharmacies to:

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1	(A)	Provide accessible prescription drug label
2		information to individuals who have difficulty
3		seeing or reading standard printed labels on
4		prescription drug containers; and
5	(B)	Make sustained, periodic, and reasonable efforts
6		to inform the public that prescription drug label
7		information is available in alternate accessible
8		formats for individuals who have difficulty
9		seeing or reading standard printed labels on
10		prescription drug containers; and
11	(2) Requ	ire the board of pharmacy to adopt certain rules
12	nece	ssary for the purposes of this Act before
13	Dece	mber 31, 2023.
14	SECTION 2. Chapter 461, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
15	amended by add	ing a new section to be appropriately designated
16	and to read as follows:	
17	"§461- Pharmacies; prescription drug label information;	
18	accessibility.	(a) When dispensing a prescription drug to an
19	individual who, as acknowledged by the individual, has	
20	difficulty see	ing or reading standard printed prescription drug
21	container labels, the dispensing pharmacy shall provide the	



1	individual with a means of access to obtain the prescription		
2	drug label information required pursuant to section 328-16(a).		
3	Specifically, the dispensing pharmacy shall:		
4	(1)	Include an electronic label affixed to the container	
5		of the prescription drug that transmits prescription	
6		drug label information, directions, and written	
7		instructions to an end-user's external accessible	
8		device, including an individual's compatible	
9		prescription drug reader; or	
10	(2)	Provide a prescription drug reader at no cost to the	
11		individual.	
12	(b)	Dispensing pharmacies shall make sustained, periodic,	
13	and reasonable efforts to inform the public that prescription		
14	drug label information is available in accessible formats for		
15	individuals who have difficulty seeing or reading standard		
16	printed labels on prescription drug containers.		
17	(c) Dispensing pharmacies shall otherwise follow the best		
18	practices and recommendations of the United States Access Board		
19	for pharmacies in providing independent access to prescription		
20	drug label information."		

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1	SECTION 3. Section 461-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
2	amended by adding two new definitions to be appropriately			
3	inserted and to read as follows:			
4	""End-user's external accessible device" means a			
5	commercially available computer, mobile phone, or other			
6	communications device that is able to receive electronic			
7	information transmitted from an external source and provide the			
8	electronic information in a form and format accessible to the			
9	individual.			
10	"Prescription drug reader" means a dedicated electronic			
11	device that is able to obtain information from an electronic			
12	label affixed to a container of prescription drugs and provide			
13	the information in an audio format accessible to the			
14	individual."			
15	SECTION 4. No later than December 31, 2023, the board of			
16	pharmacy shall adopt rules necessary to carry out the purposes			
17	of this Act. The rules adopted shall allow the board of			
18	pharmacy to deny, revoke, or suspend a pharmacy license or			
19	impose a fine not to exceed \$1000 per violation for failure to			
20	comply with the purposes of this Act.			

21 SECTION 5. New statutory material is underscored.



1 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Requires pharmacies to provide accessible prescription drug label information to individuals who have difficulty seeing or reading prescription drug container labels and inform the public that prescription drug label information is available in alternate accessible formats for individuals who have difficulty seeing or reading prescription drug container labels. Requires the Board of Pharmacy to adopt certain rules by December 31, 2023.
