A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 "§302A- Administration of emergency seizure rescue 5 medication; training. (a) Beginning January 1, 2024, each 6 school shall have at least one school employee on duty during 7 the entire school day to administer or assist with: 8 (1) The self-administration of seizure rescue medication 9 or medication prescribed to treat seizure disorder 10 symptoms approved by the United States Food and Drug 11 Administration; and 12 (2) A manual dose of prescribed electrical stimulation 13 using a vagus nerve stimulator magnet, as approved by 14 the United States Food and Drug Administration. 15 (b) The department shall ensure that all school employees 16 assigned to administer or assist with the self-administration of 17 seizure rescue medication, vagus nerve stimulator magnet, or any

20	(d)	Beginning January 1, 2024, and on an annual basis

5	(e) This section shall not apply to any school that does
6	not have at least one student enrolled who has either:

9	the United States Food and Drug Administration to
10	treat seizure disorder symptoms and prescribed by the
11	student's health care provider.
12	(f) No employee of the department shall be held liable for
13	any civil damages arising out of any act or omission relating to
14	administering or assisting with the self-administration of
15	seizure rescue mediation, vagus nerve stimulator magnet, or any
16	other medication prescribed to treat seizure disorder symptoms
17	pursuant to this section."
18	SECTION 2. Chapter 302C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated

11	SECTION 3. Chapter 302D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
12	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
13	and to read as follows:		
14	"§302D- Administration of emergency seizure rescue		
15	medication; training. (a) Beginning January 1, 2024, each		
16	public charter school shall have at least one school employee on		
17	duty during the entire school day to administer or assist with:		
18	(1) The self-administration of seizure rescue medication		
19	or medication prescribed to treat seizure disorder		
20	symptoms approved by the United States Food and Drug		
21	Administration; and		



1	(2) A manual dose of prescribed electrical stimulation		
2	using a vagus nerve stimulator magnet, as approved by		
3	the United States Food and Drug Administration.		
4	(b) Each public charter school shall ensure that all		
5	school employees assigned to administer or assist with the self-		
6	administration of seizure rescue medication, vagus nerve		
7	stimulator magnet, or any other medication prescribed to treat		
8	seizure disorder symptoms are trained by a physician, advanced		
9	practice registered nurse, or physician assistant consistent		
10	with best practice guidelines on seizure treatment and the		
11	recognition of the signs and symptoms of seizures and the		
12	appropriate steps for seizure first aid.		
13	(c) Beginning January 1, 2024, and on an annual basis		
14	thereafter, all principals, guidance counselors, and teachers		
15	employed by a public charter school shall complete at least one		
16	hour of self-study review of seizure disorder materials		
17	developed by medical professionals with expertise in seizure		
18	treatment and consistent with best practice guidelines on the		
19	recognition of the signs and symptoms of seizures and the		
20	appropriate steps for seizure first aid.		



1	(d) In the case of any student who attends a public
2	charter school and is certified by the student's physician,
3	advanced practice registered nurse, or physician assistant as
4	having a seizure disorder, the public charter school shall
5	establish a seizure action plan for that student, in conjunction
6	with the student's parent or guardian, that shall include but
7	not be limited to the identification of the employee or
8	employees trained to assist the student in the event of a
9	seizure and the method by which the trained employee or
10	employees are contacted in the event of the seizure. The
11	seizure action plan shall be:
12	(1) Distributed to every school employee or volunteer
13	responsible for the supervision or care of the student
14	diagnosed with a seizure disorder; and
15	(2) Kept on file at the school at which the student is
16	enrolled.
17	(e) Beginning January 1, 2024, and on an annual basis
18	thereafter, each public charter school shall provide an age-
19	appropriate seizure education program to all students on
20	seizures and seizure disorders. The seizure education program



1	shall be consistent with guidelines published by the Epilepsy
2	Foundation or any successor organization.
3	(f) This section shall not apply to any public charter
4	school that does not have at least one student enrolled who has
5	either:
6	(1) A seizure disorder; or
7	(2) A seizure rescue medication or medication approved by
8	the United States Food and Drug Administration to
9	treat seizure disorder symptoms and prescribed by the
10	student's health care provider.
11	(g) No employee of a public charter school shall be held
12	liable for any civil damages arising out of any act or omission
13	relating to administering or assisting with the self-
14	administration of seizure rescue mediation, vagus nerve
15	stimulator magnet, or any other medication prescribed to treat
16	seizure disorder symptoms pursuant to this section."
17	SECTION 4. Section 302A-1164, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
18	amended to read as follows:
19	"§302A-1164 Self-administration of medication by student
20	and emergency administration; [self-testing and self-management
21	of diabetes by student; assistance with diabetes testing; blood

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1	glucose monito	ring by student; assistance with blood glucose
2	monitoring;] p	ermitted. (a) The department shall permit:
3	(1) The	self-administration of:
4	(A)	Medication by a student for asthma, anaphylaxis,
5		diabetes, seizure disorders, or other potentially
6		life-threatening illnesses; and
7	(B)	Blood glucose monitoring by a student; and
8	(2) Depa	rtment employees and agents to volunteer to
9	admi	nister:
10	(A)	Insulin or assist a student in administering
11		insulin via the insulin delivery system that the
12		student uses;
13	(B)	Glucagon in an emergency situation to students
14		with diabetes;
15	(C)	Auto-injectable epinephrine in an emergency
16		situation to students with anaphylaxis; [or]
17	(D)	Seizure medication or vagus nerve stimulation in
18		an emergency situation to students with seizure
19		disorders; or
20	[(D)]	(E) Blood glucose monitoring or assist a student
21		with blood glucose monitoring.

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1	(b)	The student's parent or guardian shall provide the
2	departmen	t with:
3	(1)	Written authorization for the self-administration of
4		medication or the emergency administration of glucagon
5		or auto-injectable epinephrine[+], seizure
6		medications, or vagus nerve stimulator magnet;
7	(2)	In the case of self-administration of medication:
8		(A) Written certification from the student's
9		physician, advanced practice registered nurse, or
10		physician assistant stating that the student with
11		diabetes may perform the student's own blood
12		glucose checks, administer insulin through the
13		student's insulin delivery system, and otherwise
14		attend to the care and management of the
15		student's diabetes during any school-related
16		activity, and that the student may possess on the
17		student's person all necessary supplies and
18		equipment to perform the diabetes monitoring and
19		treatment activities, if applicable; and

1		(B) Written certification from the student's
2		physician, advanced practice registered nurse, or
3		physician assistant stating that the student:
4		(i) Has asthma, anaphylaxis, <u>seizure disorder,</u>
5		or another potentially life-threatening
6		illness; and
7		(ii) Is capable of, and has been instructed in,
8		the proper method of self-administration of
9		medication or blood glucose monitoring; and
10	(3)	In the case of administration of insulin or emergency
11		administration of glucagon to a student with diabetes,
12		blood glucose monitoring of a student, [or] auto-
13		injectable epinephrine to a student with anaphylaxis,
14		or administration of seizure medicine or vagus nerve
15		stimulation to a student with a seizure disorder,
16		written certification from the student's physician,
17		advanced practice registered nurse, or physician
18		assistant stating that the student has medical orders
19		that insulin, glucagon, blood glucose monitoring, [or]
20		auto-injectable epinephrine, seizure medication, or

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1	vagus nerve stimulation may be administered by a		
2	volunteer.		
3	(c) In the case of any student who is certified by the		
4	student's physician, advanced practice registered nurse, or		
5	physician assistant as having a seizure disorder, the department		
6	shall establish a seizure action plan for that student, in		
7	conjunction with the student's parent or guardian, that shall		
8	include but not be limited to the identification of the school		
9	employee or employees trained to assist the student in the event		
10	of a seizure and the method by which the trained employee or		
11	employees are to be contacted in the event of the seizure.		
12	The seizure action plan shall be:		
13	(1) Distributed to every school employee or volunteer		
14	responsible for the supervision or care of the student		
15	diagnosed with a seizure disorder; and		
16	(2) Kept on file at the school at which the student is		
17	enrolled.		
18	[(c)] <u>(d)</u> The department shall inform the student's parent		
19	or guardian in writing that the department and its employees or		
20	agents shall not incur any liability as a result of any injury		
21	arising from compliance with this section.		

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1 $\left[\frac{d}{d}\right]$ (e) The student's parent or guardian shall sign a 2 statement acknowledging that: 3 (1)The department and its employees or agents shall not 4 incur any liability as a result of any injury arising 5 from compliance with this section; and 6 (2)The parent or guardian shall indemnify and hold 7 harmless the department and its employees or agents 8 against any claims arising out of compliance with this 9 section. 10 [-(e)] (f) The permission shall be effective for the school 11 year for which it is granted and shall be renewed for each 12 subsequent school year upon the fulfillment of the requirements 13 in this section. 14 $\left[\frac{f}{f}\right]$ (g) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, a 15 student who is permitted to self-administer medication under 16 this section shall be permitted to carry an inhaler or 17 auto-injectable epinephrine, or both, at all times if the 18 student does not endanger the student's person or other persons 19 through the misuse of the inhaler; provided that the 20 department $[\tau]$ and its employees or agents may confiscate a 21 student's medication, inhaler, or auto-injectable epinephrine if

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1 the student's self-administration of the medication exceeds the 2 student's prescribed dosage, or if the student endangers others 3 with the student's medication, inhaler, or auto-injectable 4 epinephrine. 5 For the purposes of this section, the term "inhaler" 6 includes: 7 (1)Metered-dose, breath-actuated, and dry powder 8 inhalers; and 9 (2) Spacers and holding chambers. 10 $\left[\frac{g}{g}\right]$ (h) Any employee or agent who volunteers to 11 administer insulin or glucagon in an emergency situation to a 12 student with diabetes [or], auto-injectable epinephrine to a student with anaphylaxis, or seizure medication or vagus nerve 13 14 stimulation to a student with a seizure disorder, or who 15 volunteers to administer or assist a student with blood glucose 16 monitoring shall receive instruction in the proper 17 administration of insulin, glucagon, auto-injectable 18 epinephrine, seizure medication or vagus nerve stimulation, or 19 blood glucose monitoring by a qualified health care 20 professional. A "qualified health care professional" means a 21 licensed physician, physician assistant, advanced practice

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registered nurse or registered nurse, or certified diabetes 1 2 educator. The student's parent or quardian shall supply the 3 school with the glucagon kit required to administer the 4 glucagon, any supplies necessary to administer insulin, blood 5 glucose monitoring, or with auto-injectable epinephrine supplies 6 to administer epinephrine. The school shall store the glucagon 7 kit, insulin supplies, blood glucose monitoring supplies, or seizure medication or vagus nerve stimulator magnet, auto-8 9 injectable epinephrine supplies in a secure but accessible 10 location.

11 [(h)] (i) Any person, except for a qualified health care 12 professional providing the training required in subsection 13 [(g),] (h), who acts in accordance with the requirements of this 14 section shall be immune from any civil or criminal liability 15 arising from these acts, except where the person's conduct would 16 constitute gross negligence, wilful and wanton misconduct, or 17 intentional misconduct."

18 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 20 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 21 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal

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year 2024-2025 to train school employees to administer or assist 1 2 with the self-administration of seizure rescue medication at 3 each public school and public charter school. 4 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 5 of education for the purposes of this Act. 6 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 9 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 10 year 2024-2025 to increase health assistant and nurse services 11 in state public charter schools. 12 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 13 of education for the purposes of this Act. 14 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 15 16 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023. 17 INTRODUCED BY:

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Report Title:

Education; Seizure Safe Schools; Seizure Disorder Rescue Medication; School Employee Training; Appropriation

Description:

Beginning 1/1/2024, requires public schools, private schools, and public charter schools to have an employee trained to administer or assist with seizure disorder rescue medication. Requires all principals, guidance counselors, and teachers to perform self-study review of seizure disorder materials annually. Requires a seizure action plan for every diagnosed student and distribution of the plan to employees charged with supervising the student. Requires an annual age-appropriate seizure education program to be provided to all students. Exempts schools that do not have a student with a seizure disorder. Appropriates funds.
