# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EARLY LEARNING.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. Section 346-184, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
3	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
4	"(b) Accreditation under this section shall be obtained
5	from one or more of the following national early learning
6	accrediting organizations:
7	(1) National Association for the Education of Young
8	Children;
9	(2) National Early Childhood Program Accreditation;
10	(3) National Association for Family Child Care; or
11	(4) An accrediting organization approved by the director[ $ au$
12	provided that the accrediting organization is
13	comparable to the organizations specified in
14	paragraphs (1) through (3)]."
15	PART II
16	SECTION 2. Section 302L-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended by amending subsections (b) and (c) to read as follows:

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1	"(b)	The office shall implement an application process for
2	schools t	hat are interested in participating in the program.
3	The crite	ria to prioritize applications shall include:
4	(1)	Community need, including:
5		(A) The percentage of the population in the school or
6		community that meets the definitions of at-risk
7		and underserved children pursuant to section
8		302L-1; and
9		(B) The availability and capacity of existing early
10		learning programs or services for three- and
11		four-year-old children on the school campus and
12		in the surrounding area;
13	(2)	The availability of a classroom and outdoor play area
14		that meet department of human services requirements
15		for health and safety for three- and four-year-old
16		children; and
17	(3)	The commitment of the principal to implementing a
18		high-quality prekindergarten program including through
19		active participation in professional development
20		sessions offered through the office, and to promoting
21		continuity and alignment between and across other

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1	early learning programs in the community and other	
2	grade levels in the school to ensure the positive	
3	outcomes of children are sustained.	
4	(c) The program shall serve [ <del>children in the year prior to</del>	
5	the year of kindergarten eligibility, ] three- and four-year-old	
6	children who are in the two years prior to kindergarten entry	
7	pursuant to section 302A-411, with priority extended to	
8	underserved or at-risk children, as defined in section 302L-1,	
9	and follow the academic year schedule of the department of	
10	education and be aligned with the full-day kindergarten	
11	classroom schedule of each school. Enrollment priority shall be	
12	given but is not limited to children who attend prekindergarten	
13	at schools to which the children will be assigned upon entering	
14	kindergarten under section 302A-1143."	
15	SECTION 3. Section 346-181, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
16	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:	
17	"(b) Subject to the availability of funds, the program	
18	shall serve three- and four-year-old children[ $ au$ ] who are in the	
19	two years prior to kindergarten entry pursuant to section	
20	302A-411, with priority extended in the following order to:	

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1	(1)	Children who are not eligible to attend public school
2		kindergarten in the calendar year in which they turn
3		five years of age because their birth date occurs
4		after the kindergarten eligibility date pursuant to
5		section 302A-411; [and]
6	(2)	Underserved or at-risk [ <del>children,</del> ] <u>four-year-old</u>
7		children who were previously served as a
8		three-year-old child, as defined by rules adopted by
9		the department[-];
10	(3)	Four-year-old children who were previously served as a
11		three-year-old child;
12	(4)	Four-year-old children;
13	<u>(5)</u>	Underserved or at-risk three-year-old children, as
14		defined by rules adopted by the department; and
15	(6)	Three-year-old children."
16	SECT	ION 4. Act 210, Session Laws of Hawaii 2021, is
17	amended b	y amending section 14 to read as follows:
18	"SEC	TION 14. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
19	provided	that:
20	(1)	Section 5 shall be repealed on July 1, 2022, and
21		section [ <del>302L-7,</del> ] <u>302L-7(o) and (p)</u> , Hawaii Revised

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1		Statutes, shall be reenacted in the form in which it
2		read on the day prior to the effective date of this
3		Act;
4	[ <del>(2)</del>	Section 6 shall be repealed on July 1, 2024, and
5		section 346-181, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be
6		reenacted in the form in which it read on the day
7		prior to the effective date of this Act; ] and
8	[ <del>-{3)</del> -]	(2) Section 11 shall take effect on July 1, 2021."
