HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES TO PROVIDE MILITARY OVERSIGHT OF ALL CONTRACTORS AND CIVILIAN WORKERS AT UNITED STATES MILITARY FACILITIES IN THE STATE.

1 WHEREAS, on May 6, 2021, operator error caused more than 2 twenty thousand gallons of fuel to be released from the 3 pipelines at Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility, in an incident 4 5 that the United States Navy maintains did not directly contaminate the State's drinking water; and 6 7 WHEREAS, in November 2021, a watch stander at Red Hill ran 8 a cart into a low point drain valve, cracking a PVC pipe and 9 spilling more than nineteen thousand gallons of fuel that had 10 been deposited into the pipe by the May 6, 2021, fuel leak; and 11 12 WHEREAS, as a result of the November 2021 spill, more than 13 three thousand three hundred gallons of fuel leaked from the Red 14 Hill fuel storage tanks into the drinking water that services 15 military housing on the island of Oahu, causing widespread 16 illnesses and displacing thousands of military families; and 17 18 WHEREAS, in December 2021, groundwater sampling carried out 19 20 near Red Hill in response to the fuel spills also detected per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances, which are associated with 21 developmental defects, thyroid disease, multiple forms of 22 23 cancer, and other health concerns; and 24 WHEREAS, on November 29, 2022, Kinetix, a maintenance 25 contractor at the Red Hill facility, spilled approximately one 26 thousand three hundred gallons of concentrated aqueous film 27 forming foam, or firefighting foam, which contains per- and 28 polyfluoroalkyl substances; and 29 30

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WHEREAS, an investigation carried out by Rear Admiral 1 Christopher Cavanaugh attributed the multiple accidents and 2 spills to "a culture of complacency and . . . lack of 3 professionalism" at Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Rear Admiral Cavanaugh's report found that in 6 February 2021, the commanding officer of Fleet Logistics Center 7 8 Pearl Harbor effectively removed military oversight of the day-to-day operations at Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility; 9 and 10 11 WHEREAS, Rear Admiral Cavanaugh's report further found that 12 there were no military members on duty or providing oversight 13 14 when the May 6, 2021, fuel spill occurred; and 15 WHEREAS, Rear Admiral Cavanaugh's investigation revealed a 16 general lack of military leadership and oversight at Red Hill 17 Bulk Storage Facility, including "blurred lines of 18 responsibility, authority, and accountability"; now, therefore, 19 20 21 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 22 Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the United States 23 Armed Forces are requested to ensure military oversight of all 24 contractors and civilian workers at United States military 25 facilities in the State; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 28 29 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Secretary of 30 Defense, United States Army Pacific Commanding General, United 31 States Navy Pacific Fleet Commander, United States Pacific Air 32 Forces Commander, United States Marine Corps Forces Pacific 33 Commander, and United States Coast Guard District Fourteen Commander. 34 35 36 37 OFFERED BY:

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
