HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING HAWAII'S CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION TO INTRODUCE AND SUPPORT LEGISLATION TO AMEND TITLE IV-A OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT TO ALLOW TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES FUNDS TO BE USED BY STATES TO BUILD TRANSITIONAL SUPPORTIVE HOUSING AND AFFORDABLE RENTAL HOUSING.

WHEREAS, as of 2020, Hawaii has collected more than 1 2 \$380,000,000 in unspent Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) block grant funds, which is three hundred eighty-five 3 4 percent of the State's annual TANF block grant of \$99,000,000; 5 and 6 7 WHEREAS, according to the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities, Hawaii's unspent TANF reserves are the second 8 highest in the nation as a proportion of states' annual block 9 10 grants; and 11 12 WHEREAS, Hawaii has one of the highest rates of 13 homelessness in the nation; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Hawaii has the least affordable rental housing in 16 the nation; and 17 18 WHEREAS, according to the National Low Income Housing 19 Coalition's 2022 "Out of Reach" report, an individual would need 20 to earn \$31.15 an hour to afford a one-bedroom apartment in 21 Hawaii; and 22 23 WHEREAS, a minimum wage worker would need to work one hundred twenty-three hours a week to be able to afford a one-24 25 bedroom apartment at fair market rent; and 26

1 WHEREAS, although TANF funds can be used to provide rent 2 subsidies, such subsidies are meant to be used on a short-term 3 basis; and 4

5 WHEREAS, developing a more robust inventory of affordable 6 rental units will reduce rents statewide and enable more of the 7 State's low-income families to be able to afford housing; now, 8 therefore,

10 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 11 Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that Hawaii's 12 13 congressional delegation is urged to introduce and support 14 legislation to amend Title IV-A of the Social Security Act to allow Temporary Assistance for Needy Families funds to be used 15 16 by states to build transitional supportive housing and 17 affordable rental housing; and 18

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 19 . Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to each member of Hawaii's 20 21 congressional delegation. 22
