



## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII AT MANOA JOHN A. BURNS SCHOOL OF MEDICINE TO PRIORITIZE EFFORTS TO STRENGTHEN HAWAII'S REPRODUCTIVE CARE WORKFORCE, PARTICULARLY FOR RURAL AND REMOTE AREAS OF THE STATE.

WHEREAS, reproductive care is an essential form of health 1 care; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, in March 1970, Hawaii became the first state to legalize abortion, three years before the landmark Roe v. Wade 5 6 decision by the Supreme Court of the United States that 7 protected access to abortion nationwide; and 8 9 WHEREAS, by legalizing abortion access, the State recognized that preserving access to safe and legal reproductive 10 11 care is a vital public health objective for Hawaii; and 12 13 WHEREAS, Hawaii's unique geography and high cost of living present barriers to obtaining reproductive care for patients and 14 potential patients; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, as of 2022, only a few abortion providers host reproductive care clinics, which are generally found only in 18 19 Honolulu, on Maui, and in the Hilo area of Hawaii Island; and 20 21 WHEREAS, according to data published by Planned Parenthood, the number of abortion providers in the State has been on the 22 decline since the 1990s; and 23 24 25 WHEREAS, studies show that access to abortion care is 26 linked to financial well-being; and 27 WHEREAS, according to The Turnaway Study conducted by the 28 29 University of California San Francisco research group Advancing

1 New Standards in Reproductive Health, people who were denied 2 access to an abortion experienced an increase in household 3 poverty lasting at least four years relative to those who received an abortion; and 4 5 6 WHEREAS, the study also found that women who lacked access 7 to reproductive care were also found to be less able to pay for 8 basic living expenses and had lower credit scores and higher 9 rates of debt and eviction than those with access to abortion 10 care; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the Supreme Court of the United States' ruling in 13 Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization overturned Roe v. Wade and ended the federal constitutional right to abortion 14 15 care; and 16 WHEREAS, in overturning Roe v. Wade, the Supreme Court of 17 18 the United States erased nearly fifty years of legal precedent supporting the fundamental right to reproductive freedom, 19 20 leading to a wave of abortion restrictions enacted by state 21 legislatures across the country; and 22 23 WHEREAS, the Supreme Court of the United States' decision 24 disproportionately harms Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander, 25 Black, Latino, indigenous, and other people of color, for whom 26 access to health care and economic opportunities has historically been impeded by systemic racism; and 27 28 29 WHEREAS, in response to the ruling in Dobbs v. Jackson 30 Women's Health Organization, the State must take action to 31 uphold Hawaii's legacy as a leader in advancing reproductive 32 care and enact policies to strengthen reproductive rights in Hawaii; now, therefore, 33 34 35 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 36 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 37 Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the University of 38 Hawaii at Manoa John A. Burns School of Medicine is urged to 39 prioritize efforts to strengthen Hawaii's reproductive care 40 workforce, particularly for rural and remote areas of the State; 41 and 42

 Medicine is encouraged to consider ways of increasing financial
 assistance for students who are pursuing academic programs in
 fields related to reproductive care; and

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the John A. Burns School of 7 Medicine is requested to submit a report on its efforts to 8 strengthen the State's reproductive care workforce to the 9 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 10 the Regular Session of 2024, including any findings, 11 recommendations, and proposed legislation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Lieutenant
Governor, State Broadband Coordinator, President of the
University of Hawaii, Chairperson of the Board of Regents of the
University of Hawaii, and Dean of the University of Hawaii at
Manoa John A. Burns School of Medicine.
