## HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU'S CRISIS OUTREACH RESPONSE AND ENGAGEMENT PROGRAM TO PROVIDE REGULAR CARE AND SERVICES TO INDIVIDUALS EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS IN THE CENTRAL OAHU, NORTH SHORE, LEEWARD, AND WINDWARD REGIONS OF OAHU ON A REGULAR ROTATING SCHEDULE.

WHEREAS, homelessness is a complex and multi-faceted issue 1 that requires planning, coordination, and implementation across 2 3 state, county, business, local, and community lines; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the City and County of Honolulu established the 6 Crisis Outreach Response and Engagement Program in October 2021 7 to provide services to Oahu's unsheltered population, responding to crisis calls that are non-violent and do not require emergent 8 9 medical assistance; and 10 WHEREAS, the Crisis Outreach Response and Engagement 11 12 Program's response team includes emergency medical technicians and community health workers trained in relationship building, 13 extending compassion, problem-solving, and crisis prevention 14 15 intervention; and 16 17 WHEREAS, once the identified crisis is addressed, the Crisis Outreach Response and Engagement Program also deploys a 18 participant-centered follow-up routine that includes continual 19 20 assessment of participants' needs and linkage to community resources when necessary; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, the Crisis Outreach Response and Engagement 24 Program has initially focused on Honolulu's urban core, stretching from Chinatown to Waikiki, but has slowly expanded 25 and responded to calls in other parts of Oahu; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, although local government agencies, non-profit 29 service providers, and other private sector organizations have 30 diligently and successfully assisted homeless individuals, the

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1 number of individuals and families on Oahu has not significantly 2 decreased; and

WHEREAS, because homelessness has been a rising concern
among residents islandwide, expanding the reach of the Crisis
Outreach Response and Engagement Program throughout Oahu may
prove effective in supporting individuals experiencing
homelessness and addressing residents' concerns about Oahu's
homeless population; now, therefore,

11 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 12 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 13 Session of 2023, that the City and County of Honolulu's Crisis 14 Outreach Response and Engagement Program is urged to provide 15 regular care and services to individuals experiencing 16 homelessness in the Central Oahu, North Shore, Leeward, and 17 Windward regions of Oahu on a regular rotating schedule; and 18

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 20 Resolution be transmitted to the Mayor of the City and County of 21 Honolulu and Director of the Honolulu Emergency Services 22 Department. 23
