
HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONVENE AN ORAL HEALTH TASK FORCE TO REVIEW INFORMATION ON THE STATUS OF ORAL HEALTH IN THE STATE AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO IMPROVE ORAL HEALTH INFRASTRUCTURE IN HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, the State is unable to meet the dental public
2 health needs of its residents; and

3
4 WHEREAS, the adult Medicaid population in the State has
5 limited access to dental care; and

6
7 WHEREAS, statewide emergency department data analyzed from
8 calendar years 2016-2020 shows that a significant number of the
9 State's adult Medicaid population use emergency facilities as
10 their "dental care home", which is an ineffective method of
11 dental care and a misuse of resources; and

12
13 WHEREAS, in 2021, approximately 42,000 people of all ages
14 and all types of health insurance were served by federally
15 qualified health centers for dental care needs; and

16
17 WHEREAS, while the Department of Health operates five small
18 dental clinics that serve individuals who are elderly, blind,
19 intellectually disabled, developmentally disabled, and mentally
20 ill, the clinics are all located in the City and County of
21 Honolulu; and

22
23 WHEREAS, the State does not operate dental clinics to serve
24 similar populations on the neighbor islands; and

25
26 WHEREAS, while there are over 288,000 adults with Medicaid
27 dental benefits, there is a lack of dental providers for this
28 population, with only three hundred thirty-nine dentists who
29 currently accept and treat adults on Medicaid; and

1 WHEREAS, only eleven percent of the State's dental
2 providers serve one hundred or more persons who receive Medicaid
3 assistance; and

5 WHEREAS, while the Legislature allocated over \$25,000,000
6 in 2022 to reinstate adult Medicaid dental benefits, there is a
7 concern that the current oral health infrastructure is
8 insufficient to deliver oral health services to those most in
9 need; now, therefore,

11 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
12 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
13 Session of 2023, that the Department of Health is requested to
14 convene an Oral Health Task Force to review information on the
15 status of oral health in the State and make recommendations to
16 improve oral health infrastructure in Hawaii; and

18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to
19 comprise the following members:

- 21 (1) One representative of the Family Health Services
22 Division of the Department of Health, to be appointed
23 by the Director of Health;

- 25 (2) One representative of the Developmental Disabilities
26 Division of the Department Of Health, to be appointed
27 by the Director of Health;

30 Department of Human Services, to be appointed by the
31 Director of Human Services;

26 Association, to be appointed by the President of the

30 Systems, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House

17 Burns School of Medicine, to be appointed by the
18 President of the Senate; and

20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to
21 include the following in its study:

- 22
- 23 (1) A review of all existing information and data relating
24 to oral health status in Hawaii, including the Hawaii
25 Oral Health Coalition 2022-2023 environmental scan,
26 for evidence of key oral health issues and evident
27 areas for action;
- 28
- 29 (2) A review of all existing information and data relating
30 to the Department of Health public dental health
31 functions and program processes and recommendations
32 regarding organizational structure, personnel needs,
33 contracted service needs, required resources, and
34 potential additional funding and support;
- 35
- 36 (3) A review and analysis of systemic issues in oral
37 health services and processes statewide and
38 recommendations on systemic changes and improvements
39 to improve equity in oral health; and

- 41 (4) The feasibility of expanding community service
42 licensure requirements to:

- (A) Include community health centers as eligible organizations at which those with a community service license may practice;
- (B) Allow dental hygiene and dental college graduates who have graduated from educational programs recognized by the American Dental Association Commission on Dental Accreditation to apply for temporary or community service licenses; and
- (C) Include passage of the Integrated National Board of Dental Examination within five years of the date of request as proof of eligibility for a community service license; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the task force is further requested to:

- (1) Develop an oral health strategic blueprint that includes goals, objectives, specific actions, and resources needed;
- (2) Act as a systemic facilitator for key oral health stakeholders so that complex and problematic issues can be discussed and addressed in a timely and effective manner;
- (3) Ensure that there are agreed-upon community metrics for analyzing the development and implementation of Medicaid funding for oral health; and
- (4) Make recommendations to state and county policymakers regarding systemic actions recommended to improve oral health in Hawaii; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2024; and
