HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO CONTRACT WITH A QUALIFIED NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION TO ESTABLISH AN AQUATIC SAFETY EDUCATION PROGRAM FOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOL STUDENTS.

1 WHEREAS, drowning is a tragic but preventable cause of injury and death in the State, especially among children; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, according to the Department of Health, drowning was the leading cause of injury-related mortality for Hawaii's 5 children between 2014 and 2018; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, more children died by drowning than in motor 9 vehicle and pedestrian accidents combined, and an alarmingly large proportion of those child drownings were among resident 10 11 children; and 12 13 WHEREAS, during the same period, there were an annual average of seventy non-fatal child drowning incidents attended 14 by emergency medical services; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, although individuals who experience non-fatal drowning incidents escape with their lives, some are left with 18 severe brain damage and may face long-term disabilities such as 19 20 memory problems, learning disabilities, or permanent losses of basic functions, a disorder often referred to as a persistent 21 vegetative state; and 22 23 24 WHEREAS, many drowning deaths could be prevented through aquatic safety education programs; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, the International Life Saving Federation's 28 Position Statement for Swimming and Safety Education recommends 29 that everyone have access to training in water safety, personal 30 survival, and water rescue; and 31



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1 WHEREAS, the International Life Saving Federation recommends that this training be available to everyone 2 regardless of ability and background and should commence at the 3 4 earliest possible age; and 5 6 WHEREAS, despite these recommendations, many of Hawaii's 7 youth do not have the opportunity to receive aquatic safety 8 instruction; and 9 10 WHEREAS, less than ten percent of public and public charter elementary schools integrate aquatic safety education into their 11 physical education curricula; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, outside of schools, municipal aquatic safety programs lack the resources to meet public demand, and the cost 15 of obtaining private lessons is often cost-prohibitive for many 16 local families; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, as a result, many children are inadequately 20 prepared for water-related emergencies; and 21 22 WHEREAS, an assessment of Hawaii students conducted by the Hawaii Aquatics Academy during the 2018-2019 school year found 23 that only thirty-one percent of participating students could 24 25 swim for twenty-five yards, only twelve percent could float for 26 thirty seconds, and only thirteen percent could tread water for 27 sixty seconds; and 28 29 WHEREAS, all children should be provided equal access to standards-based aquatic safety education programs; and 30 31 32 WHEREAS, to achieve this, aquatic safety education should be integrated into the health and physical education curricula 33 of public schools; and 34 35 WHEREAS, providing proper training in water safety, 36 personal survival, and water rescue will help to ensure that the 37 38 State's youth, especially those from low- and moderate-income communities, know how to avoid and recover from hazardous 39 40 aquatic situations; now, therefore, 41



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BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 1 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 2 Session of 2023, that the Department of Education is requested 3 to contract with a qualified nonprofit organization to establish 4 an aquatic safety education program; and 5 6

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this aquatic safety education 7 program be offered to elementary school students during regular 8 9 school hours; and

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Chairperson of the 12 Board of Education, and Superintendent of Education. 13 14
