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## HOUSE RESOLUTION

ESTABLISHING THE HOUSE SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON RED HILL TO ADDRESS ISSUES RELATED TO THE RED HILL BULK FUEL STORAGE FACILITY, WATER CONTAMINATION AND REMEDIATION, AND ALL RELATED IMPACTS.

WHEREAS, the House of Representatives finds that the State 1 of Hawaii faces an emergency that requires immediate and 2 3 decisive action; and 4 5 WHEREAS, on November 28, 2021, users of the Navy's Joint Base Pearl Harbor-Hickam water system complained of a fuel odor 6 7 coming from their water, as well as an oily sheen on their 8 water; and 9 10 WHEREAS, numerous residents reported their families and 11 pets experienced health issues after consuming the water, including rashes, mouth sores, stomach aches, vomiting, burning 12 13 eyes, sore throats, headaches, and nausea; and 14 15 WHEREAS, on November 29, 2021, the Department of Health issued an advisory to all users on the Navy's water system to 16 17 avoid using the tap water for drinking, cooking, or oral hygiene 18 and also advised that users who detect a fuel odor from their 19 water should avoid using the water for drinking, cooking, 20 bathing, dishwashing, laundry, or oral hygiene; and 21 22 WHEREAS, as a direct result of the water contamination, 23 over three thousand residents were required to move out of their 24 homes and several businesses were shut down or were forced to 25 limit their operations; and 26 27 WHEREAS, several Hawaii public schools and child development centers on the Navy water system were also impacted 28 by the water contamination, forced to close off sinks and water 29 fountains and use only bottled water for handwashing, 30 31 dishwashing, and drinking purposes; and

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1 2 WHEREAS, the City and County of Honolulu Board of Water 3 Supply, to protect its drinking water system, has shut down 4 multiple water sources, including the Halawa Shaft, which supplies approximately twenty percent of water to urban 5 6 Honolulu; and 7 8 WHEREAS, these incidences are the latest in a history of at 9 least seventy leaks and spills, whereby at least an estimated 10 one hundred eighty thousand gallons of fuel are unaccounted for, 11 with an unknown percentage of fuel and contaminants in the 12 aquifer, including twenty-seven thousand gallons of jet fuel 13 spilled in 2014; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the suspected source of the water contamination 16 was from a November 20, 2021, release of approximately fourteen 17 thousand gallons of a mixture of water and fuel from a crack in a fire suppression drain line at the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage 18 Facility; and the United States Navy has identified JP-5, or jet 19 20 fuel, in the Red Hill Shaft, one of the drinking water sources 21 for the Navy water system; and 22 23 WHEREAS, as of December 3, 2021, the Department of Health received nearly five hundred complaints, mostly from residents 24 25 or customers served by the Navy water system, complaining of 26 fuel or chemical smells from the drinking water; and 27 28 WHEREAS, on December 6, 2021, this body sent a letter to Secretary of Defense Lloyd J. Austin III and Secretary of the 29 30 Navy Carlos Del Toro, to request that the Navy prepare a plan to 31 decommission the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility and store 32 the fuel in an alternate location; and to request a detailed plan for a water treatment facility to address potential 33 34 contamination as a result of the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage 35 Facility; and 36 37 WHEREAS, also on December 6, 2021, the Department of Health issued an emergency order requiring the United States Navy to 38 immediately suspend operations at the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage 39 40 Facility, as it represents "an imminent peril to human health 41 and safety or the environment" and to take measures to treat 42 contaminated drinking water at the Red Hill Shaft and to safely



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remove all fuel from the twenty underground storage tanks at Red
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   Hill; and
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         WHEREAS, the emergency order also stated that, given the
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   number of incidences that have occurred at Red Hill over the
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   past year, and in view of the current drinking water
   contamination, the United States Navy has not demonstrated and
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   cannot ensure that immediate and appropriate response actions
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   are available or will be available should another fuel release
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   occur in the future; and
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         WHEREAS, on January 3, 2022, the Department of Health
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   issued its Final Decision, Order, Findings of Fact, and
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   Conclusions of Law, upholding the December 6, 2021, emergency
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   order; and
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         WHEREAS, this body agrees with and fully supports the
   December 6, 2021, emergency order and the January 3, 2022, final
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   decision by the Department of Health; and
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         WHEREAS, the continued operation of the Red Hill Bulk Fuel
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   Storage Facility, consisting of twenty field-constructed
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   underground storage tanks, pipelines, and related
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   infrastructure, is an unacceptable threat to Oahu's groundwater
   aquifer; and
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         WHEREAS, the United States Environmental Protection Agency
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   designated Oahu's groundwater aquifer source as one of nine
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    sole-source aquifers and determined that this is the principal
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   source of drinking water for Oahu and if contaminated, would
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   create a significant hazard to public health; and
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         WHEREAS, the City and County of Honolulu Board of Water
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   Supply is exercising all due caution and will not reopen its
   Aiea and Halawa shafts until it can confirm that its systems
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   will not be negatively impacted by contaminants migrating from
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   Red Hill; and
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         WHEREAS, the permanent loss of water supply from the Aiea
   and Halawa shafts could lead to water restrictions or shortages
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   and have a cascading effect on construction, schools, public
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   health and safety; and

22 23 24 25	WHEREAS, the purpose of the House Interim Committee was to recommend legislative proposals for the 2022 Regular Session that focus on the containment, treatment, and prevention of water quality matters related to Red Hill; and
26 27 28 29 30 31	WHEREAS, on December 29, 2021, the House Interim Committee on Red Hill conducted a joint informational briefing with the Senate to receive updates from the Navy regarding the water contamination and remediation; and
32 33 34 35 36	WHEREAS, the House Interim Committee on Red Hill also discussed legislation for 2022 and, among other items, recommended continuation of the committee during the 2022 Regular Session to address emerging issues regarding Red Hill; and
37 38 39 40 41 42	WHEREAS, on June 30, 2022, the United States Indo-Pacific Command announced the establishment of the Joint Task Force Red Hill to ensure the safe and expeditious defueling of the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility in close coordination with the State; and

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1 2 WHEREAS, on November 1, 2022, the United States Navy 3 submitted its Red Hill Tank Closure Plan to the Department of 4 Health, taking the next steps to defuel and close the Red Hill 5 Bulk Fuel Storage Facility; and 6 7 WHEREAS, on November 29, 2022, the Department of Health was 8 notified of a release of approximately one thousand one hundred 9 gallons of aqueous film forming foam above Adit 6 at the Red 10 Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility, which could be devastating to 11 the Oahu's aquifers; and 12 13 WHEREAS, there is an urgent need to formulate a coordinated state and local policy, including but not limited to regulatory 14 15 functions for the remediation of the facility, surrounding area, 16 and the aquifer, to ensure the restoration and stewardship of clean drinking water for future generations; now, therefore, 17 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 20 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, that there is established the House Special 21 22 Committee on Red Hill to address issues related to the Red Hill Bulk Fuel Storage Facility, water contamination and remediation, 23 24 and all related impacts; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Special Committee consist 27 of the following members: 28 29 (1)Representative Linda Ichiyama, Co-Chair; 30 (2)31 Representative Nicole E. Lowen, Co-Chair; 32 33 (3)Representative Micah P.K. Aiu; 34 35 (4)Representative Della Au Belatti; 36 37 (5)Representative Sonny Ganaden; 38 39 (6) Representative Mark J. Hashem; and 40 41 (7)Representative Kanani Souza; and 42

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Special Committee may conduct informational briefings on issues related to Red Hill and take any other actions as the committee deems appropriate; and

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Special Committee meet and 7 report on a regular basis to the House of Representatives. 8
