RELATING TO SPECIAL NUMBER PLATES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Duke Kahanamoku 1 should be recognized for his contributions as an all-around 2 waterman, a lifeguard and lifesaver, a record-setting swimmer, a 3 4 swim and surf instructor, a five-time Olympic medalist in swimming and water polo, a sheriff of the city and county of 5 Honolulu, an early champion of volunteerism, and Hawaii's 6 original ambassador of aloha. Duke Kahanamoku was inducted into 7 the Hawaii Waterman Hall of Fame, United States Olympic Hall of 8 Fame, International Swimming Hall of Fame, and International 9 Surfing Hall of Fame. As one of the first internationally 10 recognized native Hawaiians, Duke Kahanamoku shared surfing and 11 the aloha spirit with the world, and in doing so, brought Hawaii 12 to the world's attention. It is therefore appropriate that Duke 13 14 Kahanamoku be honored with a special license plate emblazoned 15 with his name and likeness to further promote his legacy of 16 aloha.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to authorize the 1 issuance of special number plates to recognize and honor Duke 2 3 Kahanamoku. SECTION 2. Chapter 249, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 5 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 6 Special number plates for Duke Kahanamoku 7 "§249authorized. (a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the 8 9 director of finance shall issue to any registered owner of a motor vehicle, who is a resident of the State, upon completed 10 application and payment of required fees, a special number plate 11 12 for the registered owner's motor vehicle commemorating Duke Kahanamoku and his contributions to Hawaii; provided that the 13 14 director of finance of the city and county of Honolulu shall not issue any special number plate pursuant to this section before 15 16 receiving from the owner of the Duke Kahanamoku trademark, Malama Pono, Inc., written permission for the trademark to be 17 used for the special number plate and for all proceeds to 18 19 benefit the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation. - S.B. NO. designs in conformance with this subsection and subsection (C) that jointly or separately recognize Duke Kahanamoku. The special number plate design shall not: (c) Infringe upon or otherwise violate any trademark, (1) trade name, service mark, copyright, or other proprietary or property right; Represent any obscene or degrading image, idea, word, (2) or phrase; Advertise or endorse a product, brand, or service that (3) is provided for sale; Promote any religious belief; or (4) Promote any philosophy based on prejudice or that is (5) contrary to state civil rights laws. Each special number plate shall be securely fastened (d) to the motor vehicle in lieu of the uniform state number plate. The director of finance shall charge a special number (e) plate fee at least equal to the county's cost of providing the special number plate and administrative costs, if any, plus a 18 fundraising fee to be determined by the director of finance in 19 consultation with the executive director of the Outrigger Duke 20

1	to any other state or county fees collected for a motor vehicle
2	registration or license plate.
3	(f) The director of finance may charge an additional
4	fundraising fee, of the same or a different amount as the
5	fundraising fee established pursuant to subsection (e), for the
6	renewal of a special number plate. If an additional fundraising
7	fee is implemented pursuant to this subsection, the director of
8	finance shall not renew and instead shall revoke the special
9	number plate of the registered owner of a motor vehicle who
10	fails to pay the additional fundraising fee imposed by this
11	subsection.
12	(g) The revenue generated by the fundraising fees, or a
13	portion of the revenue generated by the fundraising fees as
14	determined by the director of finance, shall be deposited in the
15	name of the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation in a separate
16	county budget account. The director of finance shall determine
17	the most efficient means of directing the net revenue generated
18	by the fundraising fees to the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku
19	Foundation, as appropriate, to fund programs that promote water
20	safety and swim education across the State while developing

3	(h) The director of finance may revoke all special number
4	plates issued pursuant to this section if the total number of
5	registered owners of motor vehicles who obtain the special
6	number plates is less than one hundred fifty within three years
7	of issuance of the first special number plate.
8	(i) Nothing in this section shall be construed to apply to
9	any plates issued pursuant to section 249-9.2.
10	(j) For the purposes of this section, unless a different
11	meaning appears from the context, "special number plate" means a
12	license plate that commemorates Duke Kahanamoku."
13	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2024.
