# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that visitors are
attracted to Hawaii because of the State's natural beauty,
natural resources, cultural resources, and historical sites.
However, many of these sites are overwhelmed by the sheer number
of visitors and residents who flock to these sites during their
stay in Hawaii.

7 The legislature acknowledges the work of the Hawaii tourism 8 authority and its subcontractors who have developed destination 9 management plans for each county. Each destination management 10 plan has identified hotspots that attract visitors due to their 11 popularity, which may result in overcrowding, congestion, 12 degradation of resources, safety hazards, and a negative 13 experience for residents and visitors.

14 The legislature further finds that many of the hotspots in 15 each county are trailheads leading to hiking trails of Na Ala 16 Hele, the State's trail and access program, which is maintained 17 by the department of land and natural resources' division of

forestry and wildlife. While progress is being made to address
action items in the destination management plans, very little
progress is being made to address the hotspots.

4 The legislature recognizes that it is the role of the 5 division of forestry and wildlife, not the Hawaii tourism 6 authority, to address hotspots relating to trailheads. With the dramatic increase in trail use, intensified by residents who 7 8 escaped to the outdoors during the COVID-19 pandemic and 9 visitors exposed to the trails via social media influences, 10 additional resources are needed to manage the destination. The 11 lack of staffing to address these hotspots leads to residents 12 complaining about blocked driveways, illegal parking on state 13 and county roadways, lack of restroom facilities, constant 14 noise, lack of on-street parking for residential use, use of 15 residential water hoses to clean up, and use of residential 16 yards to gather and unwind from the day's activities.

17 The legislature also finds that the division of forestry 18 and wildlife needs additional personnel and resources to 19 prioritize hotspots relating to trails and access, work with 20 affected residents, identify alternative solutions, coordinate 21 with state and county agencies, work with community

organizations, raise funds, and implement solutions. The
legislature additionally finds that based on the successful
Haena state park model, solutions may take several years to
implement.

5 The legislature notes that although revenues from the 6 transient accommodations tax generated \$738,000,000 in fiscal 7 year 2022, only about \$2,600,000 was used in general funds, 8 special funds, and Hawaii tourism authority funds for personnel 9 and operating costs to cover the one hundred thirty-eight Na Ala 10 Hele-maintained trails throughout Hawaii.

The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for the operations and personnel of the department of land and natural resources' division of forestry and wildlife to manage hotspots at trailheads as part of the Na Ala Hele trail and access program.

16 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 17 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 18 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 19 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 20 year 2024-2025 to be used as follows:
