
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SCHOOL BUS SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the availability of
2 school bus services is essential to student attendance. School
3 bus services are particularly crucial for families who live in
4 rural and remote areas, as well as students who come from
5 socioeconomically disadvantaged communities. Currently, there
6 is a nationwide shortage of school bus drivers. This shortage
7 is impacting the State, forcing the suspension or partial
8 suspension of school bus services to ten high schools on Oahu
9 and four schools on Kauai.

10 The legislature further finds that, to address the shortage
11 of school bus drivers in Hawaii, the governor issued an
12 emergency proclamation in August 2023 to allow the department of
13 transportation to grant exemptions for the use of vehicles other
14 than school buses to transport students. Specifically, this and
15 subsequent related emergency proclamations allow for the
16 transport of students using vehicles other than school vehicles
17 by drivers possessing a commercial driver's license with an



1 endorsement authorizing the driving of vehicles carrying
2 passengers. The legislature believes that making this exemption
3 permanent may help alleviate the lack of school bus drivers.

4 The purpose of this Act is to:

5 (1) Authorize the use of motorcoaches, small buses, and
6 vans for school bus services; provided certain
7 conditions are met; and

8 (2) Appropriate funds to the department of education for
9 the purchase of motorcoaches, small buses, and vans
10 for school bus services.

11 SECTION 2. Section 286-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

13 "(b) A person operating the following category or
14 combination of categories of motor vehicles shall be examined as
15 provided in section 286-108 and duly licensed by the examiner of
16 drivers:

17 (1) Mopeds;

18 (2) Motorcycles, except for autocycles as described in
19 paragraph (2) of the definition of "motorcycle" in
20 section 286-2, and motor scooters;



1 (3) Passenger cars of any gross vehicle weight rating,
2 buses designed to transport fifteen or fewer
3 occupants, trucks and vans having a gross vehicle
4 weight rating of eighteen thousand pounds or less, and
5 autocycles as described in paragraph (2) of the
6 definition of "motorcycle" in section 286-2; and

7 (4) All of the motor vehicles in category (3) and any
8 vehicle that is not a commercial motor vehicle.

9 A school bus, small bus, motorcoach, or van operator shall
10 be properly licensed to operate the category of vehicles that
11 the operator operates as a school bus, small bus, motorcoach, or
12 van and shall comply with the standards of the department of
13 transportation as provided by rules adopted pursuant to section
14 286-181."

15 SECTION 3. Section 286-181, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
16 amended as follows:

17 1. By amending subsections (b) through (e) to read:

18 "(b) The department of transportation shall grant
19 exemptions for the use of vehicles other than school vehicles,
20 including motorcoaches, small buses, and vans, when the
21 department finds that compliance with this section is:



1 (1) Impractical due to the unavailability of school
2 vehicles; or

3 (2) Impractical due to economic factors.

4 No exemption shall be granted for the qualifications of
5 individuals driving a bus as defined in section 286-2 and such
6 individuals shall meet school vehicle driver qualifications.

7 (c) The exemptions in subsection (b) shall be granted:

8 (1) To the department of education to administer to public
9 schools based on criteria developed by the departments
10 of transportation and education; provided that the
11 department of education shall submit a report to the
12 department of transportation at the end of each school
13 year on the extent to which these exemptions were
14 utilized;

15 (2) To a board of independent schools, which is registered
16 with the department of commerce and consumer affairs,
17 to administer to private schools utilizing criteria
18 developed by the departments of transportation and
19 education; provided that the board shall submit a
20 report to the department of transportation at the end



1 of each school year on the extent to which these
2 exemptions were utilized;

3 (3) [~~Only for~~] For the transport of pupils to and from
4 school functions or school-related activities [~~but~~
5 ~~not~~], for transportation to and from a school, and
6 for transportation to and from designated drop off
7 locations and pick up locations established by the
8 department of education, in consultation with the
9 department of transportation;

10 (4) Only when each pupil being transported has obtained a
11 written statement from the pupil's parent or legal
12 guardian waiving the State's liability; and

13 (5) In accordance with the procedures and criteria
14 established by rules of the department of
15 transportation.

16 (d) [~~The~~] Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the
17 department of transportation may grant exemptions for the use of
18 vehicles other than school vehicles [~~for the transportation of~~
19 ~~students requiring special education and services~~], including
20 the use of motorcoaches, small buses, and vans, for school bus
21 services when the department of transportation finds that



1 compliance with this section is impossible or impractical;
2 provided that an adult staff chaperone provided by the
3 department of education escorts students being transported
4 between designated off-campus and designated on-campus
5 locations; provided further that no exemption shall be granted
6 for the qualifications of individuals driving a bus as defined
7 in section 286-2 and such individuals shall meet school vehicle
8 driver qualifications[-]; provided further that the use of
9 vehicles other than school vehicles shall meet any applicable
10 state and federal regulations.

11 (e) The department of transportation shall adopt safety
12 rules and standards relating to school vehicles, equipment, and
13 drivers, including but not limited to:

- 14 (1) School vehicle and school vehicle equipment design,
15 construction, and identification;
- 16 (2) School vehicle driver qualification and training as
17 required by law;
- 18 (3) School vehicle operation;
- 19 (4) School vehicle maintenance and maintenance records;
- 20 (5) Special school vehicle safety inspections;



1 (6) Criteria for passenger loading and unloading safety
2 areas; and

3 (7) Procedures and criteria for the granting of exemptions
4 permitted under subsections (b), (c), and (d);

5 provided that the rules and standards shall permit the use of
6 small buses [~~or~~], vans [~~weighing less than ten thousand pounds~~],
7 or motorcoaches for the transportation of pupils of a public or
8 private day care center, child care facility, headstart program,
9 [~~and~~] preschool, kindergarten, elementary, or secondary school,
10 including any special school for children in the State with an
11 accompanying adult staff chaperone escort provided by the
12 department of education for students transported between
13 designated locations off-campus and designated locations
14 on-campus or of school pupils and school staffs to and from
15 school-related activities."

16 2. By amending subsection (i) to read:

17 "(i) As used in subsection (b), a school vehicle is
18 unavailable when it:

19 (1) Is being used during a specific time for contracted
20 school-related transportation to and from school or
21 related destinations;



- 1 (2) Fails that day's inspection and has not been repaired;
- 2 (3) Is already in transportation service; or
- 3 (4) Is committed for transportation service[~~;~~~~or~~
- 4 ~~(5) Does not meet the requests of a school for a~~
- 5 ~~motorcoach with undercarriage storage compartments and~~
- 6 ~~public address system; provided that the use of the~~
- 7 ~~motorcoach shall be used solely for the transportation~~
- 8 ~~of middle, intermediate, or high school student groups~~
- 9 ~~to and from school-related events or activities. As~~
- 10 ~~used in this paragraph, "motorcoach" means a vehicle~~
- 11 ~~that carries more than twenty-five passengers, has a~~
- 12 ~~gross vehicle weight rating of at least 26,000 pounds,~~
- 13 ~~and is no more than fifteen years old]."~~

14 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
 16 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for
 17 the purchasing of motorcoaches, small buses, and vans for school
 18 bus services.

19 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
 20 education for the purposes of this Act.



1 SECTION 5. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
2 the Hawaii State Constitution and sections 37-91 and 37-93,
3 Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined that the
4 appropriations contained in H.B. No. , will cause the state
5 general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be
6 exceeded by \$ or per cent. In addition, the
7 appropriation contained in this Act will cause the general fund
8 expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be further
9 exceeded by \$ or per cent. The combined total
10 amount of general fund appropriations contained in only these
11 two Acts will cause the state general fund expenditure ceiling
12 for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be exceeded by
13 \$ or per cent. The reasons for exceeding the
14 general fund expenditure ceiling are that:

- 15 (1) The appropriation made in this Act is necessary to
16 serve the public interest; and
17 (2) The appropriation made in this Act meets the needs
18 addressed by this Act.

19 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
20 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.



1 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
