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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO A DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, unlike most states,
Hawaii has no executive-level department dedicated to the
mission of environmental protection and implementing the
environmental policy goals enacted by the legislature. Instead,
these functions are dispersed among multiple departments having
differing missions that either do not focus on the importance of
environmental protection or have internal conflicts.

8 The legislature further finds that because the ongoing 9 climate crisis is one of the overarching issues of modern times, 10 the protection of the State's environment and natural resources 11 is more critical than ever. Although almost all issues are multi-jurisdictional, the legislature believes that creating an 12 13 executive-level department to unite this important work under one administrative umbrella will lead to greater efficiency in 14 15 addressing Hawaii's environmental issues in a timely and 16 proactive fashion.

17 The purpose of this Act is to:
