
A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR CLAIMS AGAINST THE STATE, ITS
OFFICERS, OR ITS EMPLOYEES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 PART I

2 SECTION 1. In accordance with section 9 of article VII of
3 the Constitution of the State of Hawaii and sections 37-91 and
4 37-93, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the legislature has determined
5 that the general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2023-
6 2024 has already been exceeded by \$1,005,342,735 or 9.4 per
7 cent. The appropriations contained in this Act will cause the
8 state general fund expenditure ceiling for fiscal year 2023-2024
9 to be further exceeded by \$ or per cent. This
10 declaration takes into account the additional general fund
11 appropriation authorized for fiscal year 2023-2024 in this Act
12 only. The reasons for exceeding the general fund expenditure
13 ceiling are that:

14 (1) The appropriations made in this Act are necessary to
15 serve the public interest; and



1 (2) The appropriations made in this Act meet the needs
2 addressed by this Act.

3 PART II

4 SECTION 2. The following sums or so much thereof as may be
5 necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 are appropriated out of the
6 general revenues of the State of Hawaii to the department of the
7 attorney general for the purpose of satisfying claims for
8 legislative relief as to the following named persons, firms,
9 corporations, and entities, for claims against the State or its
10 officers or employees, for the overpayment of taxes, or for
11 refunds, reimbursements, payments of judgments or settlements,
12 or other liabilities, in the amounts set forth opposite their
13 names:

12 PART IV

13 SECTION 4. The sums hereinabove may be paid to the
14 respective persons, firms, corporations, or entities for the
15 satisfaction or settlement of the respectively identified cases,
16 and in several amounts hereinabove set forth or in lesser
17 amounts deemed appropriate, upon checks issued by the
18 comptroller; provided that departments shall obtain the approval
19 of the attorney general before payment of any claim may be made.

20 SECTION 5. Notwithstanding the sums hereinabove stated as
21 interest upon judgments against the State, payment of interest
22 shall be limited to the period from the date of the judgment, if
23 applicable, to thirty days after the effective date of this Act,
24 as provided in section 662-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for those
25 cases to which the statute applies.



1 SECTION 6. All unexpended and unencumbered balances of the
2 appropriations made in this Act as of the close of business on
3 June 30, 2025, shall lapse.

4 SECTION 7. If any provision of this Act, or the
5 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
6 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
7 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
8 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
9 of this Act are severable.

10 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
