A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that some teachers, 2 facing severe allegations such as sexual harassment of a 3 student, exploit the existing education system by resigning or retiring before they can be formally terminated. This practice 4 not only obstructs the pursuit of justice but also allows these 5 6 teachers to potentially continue their careers in other states or private schools without any consequences. Requiring teachers 7 8 who have resigned or retired in lieu of termination during the pendency of the investigation to have their teaching license 9 revoked is imperative to address a critical issue within our 10 11 education system.

12 The legislature recognizes that it is essential to rectify 13 this dangerous loophole. It is unacceptable for teachers 14 accused of serious misconduct to evade accountability by 15 relocating to different jurisdictions or institutions. 16 Requiring the revocation of these teachers teaching licenses 17 ensures that their names are added to the National Association 18 of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification

1 database, which maintains an interstate agreement with the 2 Hawaii teacher standards board. This, in turn, will ensure that 3 potential employers are aware of the unlicensed status of these 4 teachers, making it significantly more challenging for these 5 teachers to secure employment in any educational setting. This 6 Act is a necessary step to preserve the integrity of the teaching profession and protect students from potential harm, 7 8 and thus uphold ethical standards and accountability within the 9 education system.

10 SECTION 2. Section 302A-602, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended to read as follows:

12 "§302A-602 Teachers; licenses and certificates. (a) No 13 person shall serve as a teacher in the department without first having obtained a license from the Hawaii teacher standards 14 15 board in such form as the Hawaii teacher standards board 16 determines. The department shall establish types of 17 certificates in the educational field and the requirements to gualify for those certificates issued to individuals who are not 18 19 required to obtain a license pursuant to sections 302A-801 to 20 302A-808.

(b) Beginning with the 2002-2003 school year, no person

collective bargaining agreement shall serve as a teacher in the
 department without first having obtained a license pursuant to
 sections 302A-801 to 302A-808 from the Hawaii teacher standards

6 (c) Beginning with the 2002-2003 school year, the
7 department may employ unlicensed individuals as emergency hires
8 pursuant to sections 302A-801 to 302A-808.

9 (d) Any person paid under the salary schedule contained in

10 the unit 5 collective bargaining agreement shall have the

11 person's license revoked by the Hawaii teacher standards board

12 if the person resigns or retires during the pendency of any

13 investigation into allegations of sexual assault, sexual

14 harassment, or other physical abuse of a student, including

15 criminal and workplace investigations."

16 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

PURPOSE:

TITLE:

MEANS:

To mandate the automatic revocation of a teaching license if a license holder resigns or retires in lieu of termination during the pendency of certain types of investigations.

Amend section 302A-602, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).

This bill aims to address a loophole in the JUSTIFICATION: education system by requiring teachers who have resigned or retired in lieu of termination due to allegations of sexual harassment, sexual assault, or other physical abuse of a student to have their teaching license revoked. This will prevent potentially harmful teachers from continuing their careers elsewhere without consequences. The bill proposes an amendment to section 302A-602, HRS, specifically stating that teachers paid under the unit five collective bargaining agreement must have their license revoked by the Hawaii Teacher Standards Board if they resign or retire in lieu of termination during the pendency of certain types of investigations. This bill is seen as crucial to maintaining the integrity of the teaching profession, preventing accused teachers from relocating to different jurisdictions or institutions, and enhancing accountability within the education system. The bill aims to ensure that such teachers are listed in the National Association of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification database, making it difficult for them to secure employment in any educational setting.
