A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EARLY LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The legislature finds that high-quality early
2	childhood	education programs are critical for young children's
3	developme	nt. The legislature further finds that accreditation
4	by a nati	onal organization is one marker of quality in early
5	childhood	education. The legislature also finds that service
6	providers	who wish to participate in the preschool open doors
7	program m	ust achieve accreditation by July 1, 2029.
8	Ассо	rdingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
9	(1)	Establish a program to support accreditation of
10		licensed and registered child care providers;
11	(2)	Delay the deadlines for existing preschool open doors
12		service providers to commence the accreditation
13		process and obtain accreditation;
14	(3)	Appropriate funds for the child care accreditation
15		program; and
16	(4)	Appropriate funds for deposit into the child care
17		grant program special fund.

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1	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
2	amended by	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated	
3	and to read as follows:		
4	"§346- Child care accreditation program; established.		
5	(a) The c	department shall establish and implement a child care	
6	accreditat	zion program.	
7	<u>(b)</u>	The department shall develop standards, policies, and	
8	procedures	s for the administration of the child care	
9	accreditat	tion program, which shall, at minimum:	
10	(1)	Provide upfront grant funding to cover the cost of	
11		accreditation by one of the national early learning	
12		accrediting organizations, as identified in section	
13		346-184(b), or as approved by the director;	
14	(2)	Provide grant funding for technical assistance to	
15		assist a child care provider through the accreditation	
16		process; and	
17	(3)	Be available to licensed child care centers, licensed	
18		infant and toddler centers, registered family child	
19		care homes, and licensed group child care centers.	
20	(c)	The child care accreditation program may provide grant	
21	funding to	o cover incidental expenses to allow a child care	



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1	provider to receive accreditation, including but not limited to
2	expenses for furniture, equipment, or minor renovations.
3	(d) The department may contract with a service provider in
4	accordance with chapter 103D and 103F, as applicable, to operate
5	the child care accreditation program.
6	(e) The department shall report to the legislature no
7	later than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular
8	session the number and general location of programs applying for
9	and participating in the child care accreditation program, an
10	aggregated breakdown of the type and amount of costs the program
11	covered for providers, and the percentage of preschool open
12	doors providers that have begun or are currently accredited."
13	SECTION 3. Section 346-184, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
14	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
15	"(a) Each service provider of the preschool open doors
16	program shall be accredited or shall obtain accreditation within
17	seven calendar years of first receiving any funds from the
18	preschool open doors program; provided that any existing service
19	provider unaccredited on July 1, 2022, shall commence the
20	accreditation process no later than July 1, $[2024,]$ 2027, and
21	obtain accreditation by July 1, [2029;] <u>2032;</u> provided further

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1	that the director may grant to any service provider one or more
2	extensions to obtain accreditation on a case-by-case basis."
3	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
4	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
5	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
6	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
7	year 2024-2025 for the child care accreditation program
8	established by section 2 of this Act, including for the
9	establishment of one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) permanent
10	position for the child care accreditation program.
11	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
12	of human services for the purposes of this Act.
13	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
14	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
15	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
16	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
17	year 2024-2025 to be deposited into the child care grant special
18	fund established pursuant to section 346-183, Hawaii Revised
19	Statutes.

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Report Title:

Early Learning; Child Care; Accreditation; Appropriation

Description:

Requires the department of human services to establish a child care accreditation program to assist licensed and registered child care providers obtain accreditation. Amends the time period for when existing preschool open doors service providers are required to obtain accreditation. Appropriates funds for the child care accreditation program, including for the establishment of one full-time position for the program. Appropriates funds into the child care grant special fund.
