
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT AN AUDIT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF
EDUCATION'S STATEWIDE BACKLOG OF CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT REPAIR
AND MAINTENANCE PROJECTS.

1 WHEREAS, the Department of Education is responsible for the
2 repair and maintenance of 4,425 buildings statewide, which is
3 more than twenty million square feet of space; and

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5 WHEREAS, this is a time-consuming and financially-draining
6 task as approximately twenty percent of Hawaii's two hundred
7 fifty-seven public schools are more than one hundred years old,
8 and the average age of school buildings in the State is seventy-
9 two years; and

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11 WHEREAS, properly repairing and maintaining public school
12 buildings is necessary for the safety of Hawaii's students and
13 teachers; and

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15 WHEREAS, in January 2018, the Department of Education
16 reported to the Legislature that the school repair and
17 maintenance backlog was \$293,000,000; and

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19 WHEREAS, however, the Department of Education later
20 redacted that statement, reporting that the true backlog was
21 \$868,000,000; and

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23 WHEREAS, this backlog has sharply increased in the few past
24 years and is now estimated to be more than \$1,400,000,000, with
25 more than four thousand six hundred repair and maintenance
26 projects needed to be undertaken or finished by the Department
27 of Education; and

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29 WHEREAS, because many public school facilities in the State
30 are in need of repair or renovation, this body finds that it is



1 necessary to increase transparency and fiscal discipline by the
2 Department of Education; and

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4 WHEREAS, an audit of the Department of Education could help
5 identify any shortcomings in the current distribution of funds
6 and determine any necessary changes to increase the efficiency
7 of the Department of Education's capital improvement repair and
8 maintenance projects; now, therefore,

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10 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
11 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
12 Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that the Auditor is
13 requested to conduct an audit of the Department of Education's
14 statewide backlog of capital improvement repair and maintenance
15 projects; and

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17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in its audit, the Auditor is
18 requested to examine:

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20 (1) The Department of Education's processes for
21 identifying and prioritizing repair and maintenance
22 issues;
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24 (2) The Department's Facilities and Maintenance Branch's
25 processes relating to repair and maintenance projects,
26 including how the projects are initiated and managed;
27 and
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29 (3) The Department's procurement of services and how the
30 timely procurement of services may allow the
31 Department to encumber appropriations to prevent those
32 funds from lapsing; and
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34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to
35 include projects relating to the renovation of central,
36 district, and program offices in the audit; and
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38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor is requested to
39 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including
40 any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than
41 twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of
42 2025; and
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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
2 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the
3 Board of Education, Superintendent of Education, and Auditor.
