HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES TO INCREASE ONGOING HUMANITARIAN AID TO PALESTINE THROUGH THE UNITED NATIONS CHILDREN'S FUND AND WORLD FOOD PROGRAMME.

1 WHEREAS, innocent men, women, and children in Palestine 2 continue to face dire humanitarian conditions, including mass 3 displacement, loss of livelihoods, and limited access to 4 necessities such as food, clean water, and health care services; 5 and 6

7 WHEREAS, Palestinian refugees are faced with escalating 8 conflicts and crises in the region, resulting in nearly thirty 9 thousand deaths and 1,900,000 people displaced from their homes; 10 and

12 WHEREAS, the United Nations International Children's 13 Emergency Fund (UNICEF) was established on December 11, 1946, 14 and renamed in 1950 as the United Nations Children's Fund, to 15 provide humanitarian and developmental aid to children 16 worldwide; and

18 WHEREAS, UNICEF delivers gender-responsive Water, 19 Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) interventions to affected 20 populations in the Gaza Strip and responds to the urgent 21 humanitarian needs in the West Bank; and 22

WHEREAS, the World Food Programme is the world's largest humanitarian organization, saving lives in emergencies and using food assistance to build a pathway to peace, stability, and prosperity for people recovering from conflict, disasters, and the impacts of climate change; and

29 WHEREAS, the World Food Programme also supports people in30 need in Gaza and the West Bank, granting cash transfers to

1 hundreds of thousands of Palestinians and distributing thousands of metric tons of food commodities to Palestine each year; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, both of these agencies rely on voluntary contributions from governments, non-profit organizations, 5 corporations, and other private donors to assist communities in 6 need; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, in 2024, UNICEF requires \$263,300,000 for humanitarian action in Palestine, including \$74,400,000 for cash 10 transfers, \$62,200,000 for WASH interventions, and \$62,900,000 11 for health and nutrition interventions; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, according to the World Food Programme's Palestine Country Brief, it required \$225,000,000 in 2023 to maintain 15 16 their humanitarian interventions, and given that conflict has heightened in Palestine within the last few months, the funding 17 required for 2024 is surely larger; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, the President of the United States has expressed his commitment to promoting human rights and addressing 21 humanitarian crises worldwide; and 22 23 24 WHEREAS, because of the intensified conflict, violence, 25 restricted trade, and unemployment facing Palestinians currently, UNICEF and the World Food Programme urgently need 26 27 funding to support men, women, and most significantly, children 28 in need in Gaza and the West Bank; now, therefore, 29 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 31 Session of 2024, the Senate concurring, that the President of 32 33 the United States is urged to increase ongoing humanitarian aid to Palestine through the United Nations Children's Fund and 34 World Food Programme; and 35 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the 38 United States, United States Secretary of State, Administrator 39 of the United States Agency for International Development, and 40 41 members of Hawaii's Congressional delegation.
