14	teacher at her alma mater, Leilehua High School, for her entire
15	13-year career; she is also enrolled as a candidate for National
16	Board Certification in natural resources; and
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18	WHEREAS, Leilehua High School's Natural Resources Program
19	runs one of the State's largest high school agricultural farms,
20	and under JACKIE FREITAS' leadership, the school developed an
21	animal husbandry program, which offers students hands-on
22	learning experiences in large and small animal systems; she has
23	also integrated a variety of agricultural technology equipment,
24	such as smart farms, farm bots, and vertical towers, into the
25	curriculum; and

28	activities and providing project-based experiences that

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1 WHEREAS, JACKIE FREITAS is a passionate educator committed 2 to leading by example, who understands the importance of preparing students with real-world skills that extend beyond the 3 classroom; and 4 5 WHEREAS, LAURIE CHANG was recently named the Honolulu 6 District Kaimuki-McKinley-Roosevelt Complex Area 2024 Teacher of 7 the Year; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, LAURIE CHANG has demonstrated a deep passion for 11 teaching and learning while inspiring the students of Ali'iolani Elementary School to strive for excellence; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, LAURIE CHANG received a Bachelor of Science in fashion design, Professional Diploma in elementary education, 15 and certification in special education from the University of 16 17 Hawai'i at Mānoa; and 18 19 WHEREAS, an educator since 1994, LAURIE CHANG started her 20 educational career in general education and was a resource 21 teacher for the gifted; she later found a passion for students 22 with disabilities and providing support to their families and 23 caregivers; and 24 WHEREAS, LAURIE CHANG has developed tact and earned respect 25 26 through her leadership and involvement in the school's improvement process by serving as the curriculum coordinator and 27 28 pursuing additional professional and personal growth opportunities within her community; she coordinates the school's 29 technology program, accreditation process, library collection, 30 and Title 1 program and is a mentor to beginning teachers; and 31 32 33 WHEREAS, LAURIE CHANG is committed to the success and personal growth of her students, with a focus on supporting 34 students beyond the COVID-19 pandemic; she is determined to 35 36 prioritize initiatives that allow for student success, contributing to academic and social development; and 37 38 39 WHEREAS, NORMAN RAY SALES was recently named the Honolulu District Farrington-Kaiser-Kalani Complex Area 2024 Teacher of 40 the Year; and 41



1 2 WHEREAS, NORMAN RAY SALES brings a wealth of knowledge and 3 range of experiences to the field of education as he was an English Department teacher and chair, a secondary math teacher, 4 and a strategic planner; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, NORMAN RAY SALES taught at Farrington High School for nearly eight years before becoming an Educational Specialist 8 for the Hawai'i State Department of Education Na Kumu Alaka'i 9 Teacher Leader Academy; in this role, he is committed to 10 uplifting fellow teachers and supports them in becoming leaders 11 and agents of change by strengthening and refining their 12 13 disposition, knowledge, and skills; and 14 WHEREAS, NORMAN RAY SALES has been recognized for his 15 involvement with the State's Seal of Biliteracy designation, 16 which celebrates the multilingualism of students; his work also 17 18 led to an award-winning publication featuring students' 19 multilingual poetry which was entitled, VOICE: Poetry by the Youth of Kalihi; and 20 21 WHEREAS, NORMAN RAY SALES displays a consistent commitment 22 to the personal and professional development of Filipino 23 24 students through his work with the Filipino Curriculum Project, 25 which honors and encourages the incorporation of Filipino American history, culture, and identity into school studies; and 26 27 WHEREAS, NORMAN RAY SALES is held in high regard by his 28 29 school community as the epitome of a selfless servant leader due to his extraordinary teaching career and well-deserved merits; 30 31 and 32 33 WHEREAS, ARIEL VILLANUEVA has recently been named the Leeward District Campbell-Kapolei Complex Area 2024 Teacher of 34 the Year; and 35 36 37 WHEREAS, ARIEL VILLANUEVA has dedicated over 25 years of 38 his career to teaching across the State of Hawai'i at schools such as Roosevelt High School, Niu Valley Middle School, and 39 40 Kapolei Middle School; and 41

1 WHEREAS, ARIEL VILLANUEVA teaches industrial engineering 2 and technology at 'Ewa Makai Middle School and encourages his students to strive for excellence in creativity and innovation, 3 especially within his engineering design and modeling wood lab; 4 5 and 6 7 WHEREAS, ARIEL VILLANUEVA has spent his career mastering 8 his specialization in industrial engineering and technology and thus demonstrates a consistent passion for teaching and learning 9 within these fields; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, ARIEL VILLANUEVA utilizes hands-on approaches to inspire his students to involve creativity in their problem 13 14 solving endeavors related to industrial engineering and 15 technology; and 16 WHEREAS, ARIEL VILLANUEVA shares this recognition with his 17 mentors and colleagues who have supported his professional 18 19 development that has led to student success inside and outside 20 the classroom; and 21 22 WHEREAS, ARIEL VILLANUEVA's work is a testament to the care and aloha he feels for the students at 'Ewa Makai Middle School; 23 and 24 25 WHEREAS, DONNA SORIANO was recently named the Leeward 26 27 District Nānākuli-Wai'anae Complex Area 2024 Teacher of the Year; 28 and 29 30 WHEREAS, DONNA SORIANO, an educator for nearly ten years, has demonstrated a deep passion for teaching and learning 31 32 specifically in the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM); and 33 34 WHEREAS, DONNA SORIANO supports student led STEM 35 initiatives by seeking additional funding sources, including the 36 37 Armed Forces Communications and Electronics Association STEM Grants, Ed Ryglewics Innovation Grant Award, Cynthia Pacheco 38 39 Coding Grant, Hawai'i Bowl Foundation Grant, and Teach for 40 America's Extra Yard for Teachers Innovation Grant; and 41

1 WHEREAS, DONNA SORIANO's passion for STEM education extends 2 beyond the classroom to involve enrichment programs, such as the Hui 'Enehana program (Seahorse Tech Club), which was recognized 3 4 as the 2024 State Winner in the Samsung Solve for Tomorrow 5 competition; and 6 7 WHEREAS, DONNA SORIANO has additionally been awarded numerous professional accolades, including the Hawai'i Education 8 Association Ronald K. Toma Scholarship for Professional 9 10 Development and the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards Middle Childhood Generalist Teaching Certificate; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, DONNA SORIANO has served as a source of inspiration for her students of Wai'anae Elementary School to 14 strive for excellence; her commitment to providing students with 15 a wealth of opportunities is a testament to the impact teachers 16 can make inside and outside the classroom in their efforts to 17 nurture young minds and foster a love for STEM; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, GREGORY KENT was recently named the Windward 21 District Kailua-Kalāheo Complex Area 2024 Teacher of the Year; 22 and 23 WHEREAS, GREGORY KENT obtained a bachelor's degree in 24 education with a specialization in elementary education and a 25 26 master's degree in educational technology from the University of 27 Hawai'i at Mānoa; and 28 29 WHEREAS, for over 21 years, GREGORY KENT has displayed an unwavering passion for and devotion to teaching and learning and 30 has been known to consistently inspire his students to strive 31 for excellence; and 32 33 WHEREAS, GREGORY KENT is passionate about innovation, which 34 is reflected in his role as the Technology Coordinator at Kailua 35 36 Elementary School and manager of "Kailua EleMakery", a 37 makerspace that houses tools, electronics, 3D printers, lasers, and other building materials; and 38 39

Robotics Team for 15 years and mentored the Ko'olaupoko FIRST
Robotics Competition community team for two years as a LEGO
Education Ambassador; and
