# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO APPEALS.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**


1           SECTION 1. Section 641-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended to read as follows:

3           "§641-11 From circuit courts[-] and the Hawaii paroling  
4 authority. Any party aggrieved by the judgment of a circuit  
5 court in a criminal matter or an order issued by the Hawaii  
6 paroling authority may appeal to the intermediate appellate  
7 court, subject to chapter 602, in the manner and within the time  
8 provided by the rules of court. The sentence of the court in a  
9 criminal case shall be the judgment. All appeals shall be filed  
10 with the clerk of the supreme court and shall be subject to one  
11 filing fee."

12           SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
13 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

14           SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
