#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREARMS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that under existing law, 1 2 firearms safety and training requirements for purchases of 3 pistols and revolvers do not apply to purchases of rifles and 4 shotguns. The legislature believes that there is no 5 justification for this disparity, given the importance of safe 6 and appropriate handling of all firearms, regardless of type. 7 The legislature also finds that, in the interest of national security, permits to acquire firearms should not be 8 9 issued to aliens who are not state law enforcement officers, 10 even for temporary purposes such as hunting or participating in 11 an organized sport-shooting contest. 12 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:

13 (1) Establish uniform firearms safety and training
14 requirements for applicants of permits to acquire
15 firearms, regardless of firearm type;

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1	(2)	Prohibit the issuance of permits to acquire firearms
2		to aliens who are not state law enforcement officers;
3		and
4	(3)	Require a fee of not less than \$100 for permits, or
5		applications for permits.
6	SECT	ION 2. Section 134-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended as follows:	
8	1.	By amending subsection (d) to read:
9	"(d)	The chief of police of the respective counties may
10	issue permits to acquire firearms to citizens of the United	
11	States of the age of twenty-one years or more, or duly	
12	accredited official representatives of foreign nations, or duly	
13	commissioned law enforcement officers of the State who are	
14	aliens; provided that any law enforcement officer who is the	
15	owner of	a firearm and who is an alien shall transfer ownership
16	of the firearm within forty-eight hours after termination of	
17	employment from a law enforcement agency. [The chief of police	
18	of each county may issue permits to aliens of the age of	
19	eighteen years or more for use of rifles and shotguns for a	
20	period not exceeding sixty days, upon a showing that the alien	
21	has first procured a hunting license under chapter 183D, part	

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1	II. The chief of police of each county may issue permits to
2	aliens of the age of twenty one years or more for use of
3	firearms for a period not exceeding six months, upon a showing
4	that the alien is in training for a specific organized sport-
5	shooting contest to be held within the permit period. The
6	attorney general shall adopt rules, pursuant to chapter 91, as
7	to what constitutes sufficient evidence that an alien is in
8	training for a sport shooting contest.] Notwithstanding any law
9	to the contrary and upon joint application, the chief of police
10	may issue permits to acquire firearms jointly to spouses who
11	otherwise qualify to obtain permits under this section."
12	2. By amending subsection (g) to read:
13	"(g) [ <del>Effective July 1, 1995, no</del> ] <u>No</u> person shall be
14	issued a permit under this section for the acquisition of a
15	pistol or revolver unless the person, at any time prior to the
16	issuance of the permit, has completed:
17	(1) An approved hunter education course as authorized
18	under section 183D-28;
19	(2) A firearms safety or training course or class
20	available to the general public offered by a law
21	enforcement agency of the State or of any county;



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1	(3)	A firearms safety or training course offered to law
2		enforcement officers, security guards, investigators,
3		deputy sheriffs, or any division or subdivision of law
4		enforcement or security enforcement by a state or
5		county law enforcement agency; or
6	(4)	A firearms training or safety course or class
7		conducted by a state certified or National Rifle
8		Association certified firearms instructor or a
9		certified military firearms instructor that provides,
10		at a minimum, a total of at least two hours of firing
11		training at a firing range and a total of at least
12		four hours of classroom instruction, which may include
13		a video, that focuses on:
14		(A) The safe use, handling, and storage of firearms
15		and firearm safety in the home; and
16		(B) Education on the firearm laws of the State.
17		An affidavit signed by the certified firearms
18		instructor who conducted or taught the course,
19		providing the name, address, and phone number of the
20		instructor and attesting to the successful completion
21		of the course by the applicant shall constitute



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1	evidence of certified successful completion under this				
2	paragraph."				
3	3. By amending subsection (i) to read:				
4	"(i) [No] A fee of not less than \$100 shall be charged for				
5	permits, or applications for permits, under this section,				
6	[except for] as well as a single fee chargeable by and payable				
7	to the issuing county, for individuals applying for their first				
8	permit, in an amount equal to the fee charged by the Hawaii				
9	criminal justice data center pursuant to section 846-2.7. In				
10	the case of a joint application, the [ <del>fee</del> ] <u>fees</u> provided for in				
11	this section may be charged to each person to whom no previous				
12	permit has been issued."				
13	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that				
14	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were				
15	begun before its effective date.				
16	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed				
17	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.				
18	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
