A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BEHAVIORAL HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to require the
2	department of health to establish or contract with behavioral
3	health crisis centers to provide intervention and stabilization
4	services in each county for persons experiencing mental health
5	or substance use disorder crises.
6	SECTION 2. Chapter 334, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
8	designated and to read as follows:
9	"§334- Behavioral health crisis centers. (a) Pursuant
10	to the authority and functions established under
11	sections 334-2.5(a)(3)(B) and 334-3(a)(5), the director shall
12	establish or contract with behavioral crisis centers in each
13	county to provide care, diagnoses, and treatment for persons
14	experiencing mental health or substance use disorder crises.

15	(b) Each behavioral health crisis center established or
15	(b) Each behavioral health crisis center established or contracted with pursuant to this section shall:



1		(A)	Address mental health and substance use disorder
2			crises;
3		<u>(B)</u>	Screen, assess, admit for stabilization, and
4			redirect a client to ongoing care in the most
5			appropriate and least restrictive community
6			setting available, consistent with the client's
7			needs; and
8		<u>(C)</u>	Assess a client's physical health needs and
9			deliver care for most minor physical health
10			challenges;
11	(2)	Prov	ide services at all times, day or night;
12	(3)	<u>Acce</u>	pt and provide services to all walk-in clients and
13		refe	rral clients regardless of the client's ability to
14		pay,	subject to subsection (c);
15	(4)	<u>Offe</u>	r a dedicated drop-off area for use by first
16		resp	onders;
17	(5)	Prov	ide assessment and support for a client's mental
18		stab	ility while at the crisis center without requiring
19		medi	cal clearance prior to admission;

1	(6)	Assess all clients for their risk of suicide or
2		violence, with more comprehensive risk assessments and
3		planning when clinically indicated; and
4	(7)	Be staffed at all times with a multidisciplinary team
5		who are capable of meeting the needs of clients
6		experiencing a range of mental health or substance use
7		disorder crises, including:
8		(A) Psychiatrists or psychiatric nurse practitioners;
9		(B) Nurses;
10		(C) Licensed or credentialed clinicians, capable of
11		completing client assessments; and
12		(D) Staff with lived experience similar to the lived
13		experience of some clients.
14	<u>(c)</u>	No person shall be denied services or receive delayed
15	<u>care at a</u>	behavioral health crisis center operating under this
16	section b	ased on the person's inability to pay; provided that,
17	<u>subject t</u>	o section 334-6, the crisis center shall make every
18	reasonabl	e effort to collect appropriate reimbursement for the
19	<u>cost of t</u>	he provided services from any person able to pay,
20	including	insurance companies or third-party payers.

1	(d) The director shall adopt rules pursuant to					
2	section 334-9 to implement this section, including rules					
3	specifying:					
4	(1) Eligibility standards for contracted behavioral health					
5	crisis centers;					
6	(2) Clinical procedures;					
7	(3) Staffing requirements; and					
8	(4) Operational, administrative, and financial					
9	requirements."					
10	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general					
11	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much					
12	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the					
13	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year					
14	2024-2025 for the director of health to establish or contract					
15	with behavioral health crisis centers pursuant to this Act.					
16	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department					
17	of health for the purposes of this Act.					
18	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.					
19	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
