# <u>S</u>.B. NO. <u>1403</u> JAN 2 5 2023 A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MOTOR CARRIER VEHICLE INSPECTIONS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 286-209, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 2

3 "§286-209 Safety inspection of motor carrier

(a) Motor carrier vehicles, including but not 4 vehicles. limited to trucks, truck-tractors, semitrailers, trailers, or 5 pole trailers, having a gross vehicle weight rating of more than 6 7 ten thousand pounds, motor carrier vehicles having a gross 8 vehicle weight rating of ten thousand pounds or less which transport passengers in the furtherance of a commercial 9 10 enterprise, including car rental transport vehicles, and motor carrier vehicles used in transporting material found by the 11 12 United States Secretary of Transportation to be hazardous under 13 49 U.S.C. section 5103 and transported in a quantity requiring placarding under 49 C.F.R., subtitle B, chapter I, subchapter C, 14 shall be inspected and certified annually. 15

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1	(b) The director shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91
2	for the administration and enforcement of motor carrier vehicle
3	safety inspections, including the maximum inspection fee to
4	vehicle owners, fees collected from the stations, the issuance
5	of certificates of safety inspection, the affixing of motor
6	carrier vehicle safety inspection [decals,] stickers, and the
7	acceptance of certificates of safety inspection issued in other
8	jurisdictions.
9	(c) The director shall <u>initially</u> collect a fee of \$1.50
10	for each motor carrier vehicle safety inspection [ <del>decal</del> ] <u>sticker</u>
11	issued by motor carrier vehicle inspection stations[-], then
12	collect the maximum inspection fee when the fee is established
13	by administrative rules pursuant to subsection (b). All moneys
14	[collected] received by the department of transportation
15	pursuant to this section shall be [paid] deposited into the
16	state highway fund.
17	(d) A fee of no more than \$12 shall <u>initially</u> be charged
18	by a motor carrier inspection station for each safety inspection
19	performed $[-]$ , then no more than the maximum inspection fee shall
20	be charged when the fee is established by administrative rules
21	pursuant to subsection (b).

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1 (e) For the purposes of this section, "car rental 2 transport vehicles" means motor carrier vehicles used to transport customers to or from car rental sites." 3 SECTION 2. Section 286-210, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended to read as follows: 5 6 "§286-210 Operation of a motor carrier vehicle without a 7 safety inspection [decal.] sticker. Whoever operates, permits 8 the operation of, causes to be operated, or parks any motor carrier vehicle on a public highway without a current motor 9 10 carrier vehicle safety inspection [decal,] sticker, issued under section 286-209, shall be fined \$100 for each day of the 11 12 violation." 13 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 14 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were begun, before its effective date. 15 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 17 SECTION 5. #### JUSTIFICATION SHEET

- DEPARTMENT: Transportation
- TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO MOTOR CARRIER VEHICLE INSPECTIONS.
- PURPOSE: To allow the Director of Transportation to upgrade the motor carrier vehicle inspections in the State by authorizing changes to the program to be implemented by administrative rules.
- MEANS: Amend sections 286-209(b), (c), and (d) and 286-210, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- JUSTIFICATION: There is a need to upgrade the methods and procedures of motor carrier vehicle inspections.

Amending administrative rules is a more efficient means of making changes and adapting more quickly to the changing needs of the program. This bill gives the director authority to make program changes using the process established in chapter 91, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

<u>Impact on the public:</u> This bill will allow the program to be run more efficiently, thereby improving service and value to the public. The interests of the public are protected by public hearings that allow an opportunity for public input on any administrative rule amendment.
