7 SECTION 2. The appropriations made for the capital
8 improvement projects authorized by this Act shall not lapse at
9 the end of the fiscal year for which the appropriations are
10 made; provided that all moneys from the appropriations that are
11 unencumbered as of June 30, 2026, shall lapse as of that date.

12 SECTION 3. The sums appropriated for the respective
13 capital improvement projects set forth in section 1 shall be
14 expended for the purposes of this Act as follows:

15 (1) The sums appropriated in items 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9,
16 10, and 12 shall be expended by the department of
17 education;

18 (2) The sum appropriated in item 2 shall be expended by
19 the department of land and natural resources; and

20 (3) The sum appropriated in item 11 shall be expended by
21 the university of Hawaii.


