A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIME.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature acknowledges the harmful
 effects of illegal gambling and drug activities in communities
 across the State. These effects include an increase in other
 criminal activities, such as crimes of violence and sex
 trafficking.

6 The legislature believes that, rather than attempting to 7 address these criminal activities in a piecemeal fashion, an 8 intergovernmental task force comprising federal, state, and city 9 agencies should be established to engage in an organized, 10 collaborative effort to examine relevant issues, determine the 11 resources needed to address these issues, and devise a 12 coordinated action plan.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a special intergovernmental task force to eradicate illegal gambling and drug activities and to establish community safe zones across the State.

SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the department 1 2 of the attorney general for administrative purposes a special 3 intergovernmental task force to eradicate illegal gambling and drug activities. 4 5 The task force shall consist of the following members: (b) The state attorney general or the attorney general's 6 (1)designee, who shall serve as chair of the task force; 7 8 The director of law enforcement or the director's (2)9 designee; 10 (3)The director of transportation or the director's 11 designee; 12 The respective chiefs of police of the counties of (4) 13 Hawaii, Maui, Kauai, and of the City and County of 14 Honolulu, or their designees; and 15 The respective directors of the planning or permitting (5) 16 agencies of the counties of Hawaii, Maui, Kauai, and 17 of the City and County of Honolulu, or their 18 designees. 19 (c) Representatives from the following entities shall be 20 invited to participate by the chair of the task force:

1 A statewide program under the department of the (1) 2 attorney general to identify and eliminate illegal 3 gambling houses and drug houses; and 4 (2) Community safe zones throughout the State for the 5 purpose of enforcing zoning and other restrictions on 6 lands that may be used for gambling activities, 7 including casino gaming, regardless of whether the 8 activities are legal or illegal; provided that the 9 task force shall endeavor to establish, at a minimum, 10 a requirement that lands that may be used for any type 11 of gambling activity, and any structure thereupon, be 12 situated more than ten thousand feet away from any 13 church, school, or residential area; provided further 14 that the task force shall also endeavor to establish 15 an appropriate enforcement mechanism for this 16 requirement.

17 (e) The chair and vice chair of the task force shall
18 oversee the activities of the task force and lead the
19 decision-making of the task force members.

20 (f) The task force shall submit a report of its findings21 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the

3	(g) The members of the task force shall serve without		
4	compensation and shall receive no reimbursement for expenses.		
5	(h) The members of the task force shall not be considered		
6	employees for the purposes of chapter 84, Hawaii Revised		
7	Statutes, based solely upon their participation in the task		
8	force.		
9	(i) The task force shall be dissolved upon adjournment		
10	sine die of the regular session of 2024.		
11	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
