## A BILL FOR AN ACT

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 444-10.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:
3	"(e) Any person who violates section 444-9[ <del>, in connection</del>
4	with the offer or performance of repairs to a residential or
5	nonresidential-structure for damage caused by a natural disaster
6	<u>in]:</u>
7	(1) During or within five years following a national
8	emergency proclaimed by the President or the Congress
9	of the United States or a state of emergency
10	proclaimed by the governor; and
11	(2) Within a political subdivision for which [a state of]
12	the emergency or disaster is proclaimed [ <del>by the</del>
13	governor, may-punished by a fine of up to \$10,000,
14	imprisonment up to one year, or both],
15	shall be guilty of a class B felony, in addition to all other
16	remedies or penalties."
