A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VITAL STATISTICS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in 2019, it passed
- 2 H.B. No. 1165, which the governor signed into law as Act 148.
- 3 This law expanded gender markers for Hawai'i's driver's licenses
- 4 and state identification cards. The legislature further
- 5 acknowledges that on July 1, 2020, that law went into effect
- 6 smoothly. In other states, such as Washington, the third gender
- 7 marker has also been instated for other official documents, such
- 8 as birth certificates. This ensures that an individual's gender
- 9 markers match on the individual's driver's license, state
- 10 identification card, and other official documents. The purpose
- 11 of this Act is to add the third gender marker "X" as a third
- 12 gender option on birth certificates.
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 338-17.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- "(a) The department of health shall establish, in the
- 16 following circumstances, a new certificate of birth for a person
- 17 born in this State who already has a birth certificate filed



with the department and who is referred to below as the "birth
registrant":

- Upon receipt of an affidavit of paternity, a court 3 (1) order establishing paternity, or a certificate of marriage establishing the marriage of the natural 5 parents to each other, together with a request from 6 7 the birth registrant, or the birth registrant's parent or other person having legal custody of the birth 8 registrant, that a new birth certificate be prepared 9 10 because previously recorded information has been 11 altered pursuant to law;
- 12 (2) Upon receipt of a certified copy of a final order,
 13 judgment, or decree of a court of competent
 14 jurisdiction that determined the nonexistence of a
 15 parent and child relationship between a person
 16 identified as a parent on the birth certificate on
 17 file and the birth registrant;
- 18 (3) Upon receipt of a certified copy of a final adoption 19 decree, or of an abstract of the decree, pursuant to 20 sections 338-20 and 578-14;

1	(4)	Upon	receipt of an affidavit [from a United States
2		licer	nsed physician or physician assistant attesting
3		that:	-
4		(A)	The physician or physician assistant has a bona
5			fide provider-patient-relationship with the birth
6			registrant;
7		(B)	The physician or physician assistant has treated
8			and evaluated the birth registrant and has
9			reviewed and evaluated the birth registrant's
10			medical history;
11		(C)	The birth registrant has had appropriate clinical
12			treatment for gender transition to the new gender
13			and has completed the transition to the new
14			gender; and
15		(D)	The new gender does not align with the sex
16			designation on the birth registrant's birth
17			<pre>certificate;]</pre>
18		for a	change in sex designation on a person's own
19		birth	certificate by an adult, or for a change in sex

17		birth certificate;

19	<u>(vi)</u>	Sex designation requested (male, female, or
20		<u>X);</u>

1	<u>(D)</u>	If an adult, or parent or legal guardian, cannot
2		provide the information in paragraph (C), the
3		adult, or parent or legal guardian, shall submit
4		a written explanation of the circumstances to the
5		state registrar. The department may change the
6		sex designation on the birth certificate if, in
7		the state registrar's judgment, these
8		circumstances prevent the adult, or parent or
9		legal guardian, from knowing one or more of the
10		required items;
11	<u>(E)</u>	The sex designation change application of an
12		adult shall be notarized and signed under penalty
13		of perjury;
14	<u>(F)</u>	The sex designation change application of a minor
15		shall include a signed statement by the minor's
16		licensed health care provider attesting that:
17		(i) The minor identified on the application is
18		under the care of the provider; and
19		(ii) The provider has determined the request to
20		change sex designation on the birth

1		certificate is consistent with the minor's
2		identity; and
3		(G) Only licensed health care providers whose scope
4		of practice allows for attestation of a sex
5		designation change may provide this attestation;
6		(H) As used in this paragraph:
7		"Adult" means a person who is at least
8		eighteen years of age or older, or is an
9		emancipated minor under chapter 577-25; and
10		"X" means a third non-binary gender option;
11		or
12	(5)	Upon request of a law enforcement agency certifying
13		that a new birth certificate showing different
14		information would provide for the safety of the birth
15		registrant; provided that the new birth certificate
16		shall contain information requested by the law
17		enforcement agency, [shall] be assigned a new number
18		and filed accordingly, and [shall] not substitute for
19		the birth registrant's original birth certificate,
20		which shall remain in place."

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- 1 SECTION 3. The department of health shall create and make
- 2 available the necessary forms for the application for the
- 3 establishment of a new certificate of birth for all categories
- 4 listed in section 338-17.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 5 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023;
- 8 provided that section 2 shall take effect on January 1, 2024.

Beginning 1/1/2024, allows a qualified applicant to change their sex designation on their birth certificate. Establishes information required for an applicant to change their sex designation on their birth certificate.
