RELATING TO BOARD MEETINGS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 92-3.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows: 3 "(a) A board [may] shall hold a remote meeting by 4 interactive conference technology; provided that the interactive 5 conference technology used by the board allows audiovisual 6 interaction among all members of the board participating in the 7 meeting and all members of the public attending the meeting, 8 except as otherwise provided under this section; provided 9 further that there is at least one meeting location that is open 10 to the public and has an audiovisual connection. A board 11 holding a remote meeting pursuant to this section shall not be required to allow members of the public to join board members in 12 13 person at nonpublic locations where board members are physically 14 present or to identify those locations in the notice required by 15 section 92-7; provided that at the meeting, each board member 16 shall state who, if anyone, is present at the nonpublic location with the member. The notice required by section 92-7 shall: 17

5	(2)	Except as provided in subsections (c) and (d), a
6		quorum of board members participating in the meeting
7		shall be visible and audible to other members and the
8		public during the meeting; provided that no other
9		meeting participants shall be required to be visible
10		during the meeting;
11	(3)	Any board member participating in a meeting by
12		interactive conference technology shall be considered
13		present at the meeting for the purpose of determining
14		compliance with the quorum and voting requirements of
15		the board;
16	(4)	At the start of the meeting the presiding officer
17		shall announce the names of the participating members;
18	(5)	All votes shall be conducted by roll call unless
19		unanimous; and
20	(6)	[When practicable, boards] Boards shall record
21		meetings open to the public and make the recording of

any meeting electronically available to the public as 1 soon as practicable after a meeting and until a time 2 as the minutes required by section 92-9 are 3 electronically posted and archived on the board's 4 website." 5 SECTION 2.
