A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NATURAL ENERGY LABORATORY OF HAWAII AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that since its inception in 1974, the natural energy laboratory of Hawaii authority and 2 3 its administration of Hawaii ocean science and technology (HOST) 4 park is well on track to fulfilling its mission as an 5 substantial engine for environmentally sustainable economic 6 development in Hawaii. HOST park has become the world's premier 7 ocean science innovation hub and operates at the nexus of water, 8 energy and food, with a state annual economic impact of 9 \$150,000,000 and the creation of over six hundred jobs 10 statewide.

11 The legislature further finds that the laboratory's 12 original mission for research into the uses of deep ocean water 13 in ocean thermal energy conversion renewable energy production 14 has since expanded widely into other areas of sustainability 15 research such as aquaculture, algae biofuel, solar thermal 16 energy, solar concentrating, and wind power, among others.

1 The purpose of this Act is to further support and invest 2 into the successes of the natural energy laboratory of Hawaii authority by appropriating funds and thereby enhancing its 3 4 operational capacity over the long term.

5 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the 8 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 9 2024-2025 for the continued operation and improvement of the 10 natural energy laboratory of Hawaii authority.

11 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 12 of business, economic development and tourism for the purposes 13 of this Act.

14 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
