A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FISHING SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that existing state law
protects fishers from harassment if they are taking fish
pursuant to a freshwater game fishing license. There is a need
to extend these protections to all persons fishing in marine
waters to promote the safety and enjoyment of individuals
engaged in fishing activities.

7 The legislature further finds that makai watch is an 8 official program of the department of land and natural 9 resources, which enhances protection of nearshore and coastal 10 resources by providing community members opportunities to work 11 and interact with resource managers and enforcement officers in 12 their community. The makai watch program plays an important 13 role as the eyes and ears of the division of conservation and 14 resources enforcement. Makai watch volunteers participate in 15 two types of activities:

16 (1) Observation and incident reporting; and

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(2) Awareness raising and outreach.



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1 Volunteers in the makai watch program are trained to conduct these activities in a manner that does not interfere with 2 3 fishing activities. 4 The purpose of this Act is to: 5 Prohibit purposeful harassment with the intent to (1) 6 prevent the taking of fish by people who are fishing; 7 and (2) Extend protections against harassment to all persons 8 9 fishing in marine waters. 10 SECTION 2. Section 188-71, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 11 amended to read as follows: "[+] §188-71[+] Harassment of [fishermen;] fishers; 12 13 prohibition. (a) No person shall intentionally prevent or 14 attempt to prevent the lawful taking of fish by a person 15 [licensed-pursuant to section 188-50] fishing in state waters 16 by[+] purposely: 17 (1) Placing the person's self in a location in which human 18 presence may affect the behavior of fish to be taken 19 or the feasibility of taking such fish; 20 (2) Creating a visual, aural, olfactory, or physical 21 stimulus to affect the behavior of fish to be taken;



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1	(3)	Affecting the condition or placement of personal
2		property intended for use in the taking; or
3	(4)	Obstructing the person's access to areas in which the
4		person intends to lawfully take fish $[-,]_{\underline{\prime}}$
5	with the i	intent to prevent the taking of fish.
6	(b)	No person shall enter or remain upon public lands or
7	waters, or	r upon private lands or waters, without permission of
8	the owner	or the owner's agent, with intent to violate this
9	section.	
10	(c)	It shall not be a violation of subsection (a) to:
11	(1)	Take photographs or video recording of a person
12		engaged in the taking of fish or related activities
13		while over one hundred feet away from the person; or
14	(2)	Engage in activities pursuant to the department of
15		land and natural resources' makai watch program.
16	[(c)]	(d) The maximum penalty for violation of subsection
17	(a) or (b)	is a fine of \$500, thirty days imprisonment, or
18	both."	
19	SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that	
20	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were	
21	begun before its effective date.	

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SECTION 4 Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

3 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
