A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUNTING GUIDES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that guided hunting tours
- 2 help manage game populations, provide a livelihood for hunting
- 3 quides, and help drive Hawaii's economy. The legislature
- 4 further finds that, with the rising popularity of guided hunting
- 5 tours, some hunting guides are taking their clients to hunt on
- 6 private lands without obtaining permission from the landowners,
- 7 and landowners have alarmingly witnessed unknown persons walking
- 8 on their land with guns or other weapons. While existing law
- 9 prohibits hunters from hunting on private lands without first
- 10 obtaining permission from the landowner, some hunting guides
- 11 misrepresent to their clients that they have obtained verbal
- 12 permission from the landowner, leading to disagreements and
- 13 allegations of trespassing, which damages the reputation of the
- 14 State's guided hunting tour industry.
- 15 The purpose of this Act is to require hunting guides to:

1	(1)	Obtain written permission from the owners of private
2		lands before taking their clients to hunt on the
3		private land; and
4	(2)	Submit a copy of the written permission to the
5		department of land and natural resources as part of
6		their annual reports.
7	SECT	ION 2. Section 183D-25.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended b	y amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
9	"(c)	Hunting guides shall [provide], within thirty days
10	after the	expiration of their hunting guide licenses issued
11	pursuant	to this section, submit an annual report of their guide
12	activitie	s to the department [of their guide activities that].
13	The annua	l report shall include [the]:
14	(1)	The number of clients served [and the];
15	(2)	<pre>The clients' residency status[-];</pre>
16	(3)	The location of each guided hunt;
17	(4)	For each guided hunt that occurred on private land, a
18		copy of the written permission from the owner or duly
19		appointed agent of the land or premises effective at
20		the time of the guided hunt that was issued to the
21		hunting guide pursuant to section 183D-26(b); and

1 Other information as required by the department. (5) 2 [The reports shall be submitted within thirty days after the expiration of the hunting guide license issued pursuant to this 3 4 section. The failure | Failure to submit an annual report within the time specified shall be grounds for the revocation and 5 nonrenewal of the hunting guide license." 6 7 SECTION 3. Section 183D-26, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended to read as follows: 9 "§183D-26 Hunting on private lands prohibited. (a) person shall enter upon any land or premises belonging to, held, 10 11 or occupied by another, for the purpose of hunting or to take any kind of wildlife, including game, without first having 12 13 obtained permission from the owner or a duly appointed agent [7] 14 if]; provided that the owner is the occupier or holder[, or if] 15 of the land or premises; provided further that, if the owner has 16 let another occupy or hold the [same, without having first 17 obtained] land or premises, the permission [of] shall be 18 obtained from the occupier or holder [thereof], or the duly 19 appointed agent of the occupier or holder [-] of the land or 20 premises.

1 (b) Hunting quides licensed pursuant to section 183D-25.5 2 shall first obtain the permission required in subsection (a) in 3 writing before guiding clients upon private lands. [(b)] (c) No prosecution shall be brought under this 4 5 section, except upon the sworn complaint of the owner, occupier, 6 or holder of the land or premises, or a duly appointed agent [7] 7 er]; provided that, if the owner, occupier, or holder is either 8 a corporation or a partnership, [then] the complaint shall be 9 sworn to by an officer of the corporation or [by one of the 10 members] a member of the partnership." 11 SECTION 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 12 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 13 begun before its effective date. 14 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 15 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 16 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2024; 17 provided that the amendments made by section 2 shall apply to 18 all annual reports submitted for the July 1, 2024, through 19

- 1 June 30, 2025, period and all annual reports submitted
- 2 thereafter.

Hunting Guides; Private Land; Annual Reports; Department of Land and Natural Resources; Written Permission

Description:

Requires hunting guides who take their clients to hunt on private lands to first obtain written permission from the owner of the private land, or occupier or holder, where appropriate. Requires hunting guides to provide copies of the written permissions obtained to hunt on private lands as part of their annual reports to the Department of Land and Natural Resources.

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
