## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE FOOD SYSTEMS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a sustainable food
 system is one in which producers, retailers, members of the
 community, nongovernmental organizations, and government
 agencies partner to create a vibrant and resilient local food
 economy that enhances and sustains the environmental, economic,
 and social health of the community.

7 The legislature further finds that developing an improved 8 sustainable food system for Hawaii is an opportunity to create a 9 new food economy that integrates the objectives of "green" job 10 creation, sustainable economic development, land stewardship, 11 food security, environmental protection, and climate change 12 resiliency with community health and well-being.

13 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to establish within 14 the office of planning and sustainable development the 15 sustainable food systems working group.

16 SECTION 2. (a) There is established within the office of 17 planning and sustainable development the sustainable food
