SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO SUPPLY ALL CLASSROOMS WITH
NARCAN OR ANOTHER TYPE OF NALOXONE BY SEPTEMBER 1, 2024.

1 WHEREAS, according to the National Institute on Drug Abuse,
2 there were more than eighty thousand reported overdose deaths
3 involving opioid during 2020; and

4
5 WHEREAS, deaths caused by opioids are often preventable
6 through timely administration of an opioid antagonist, such as
7 naloxone, also known as Narcan; and

8
9 WHEREAS, opioid antagonists have been approved by the
10 federal Food and Drug Administration, and these medications have
11 been used for more than forty years by emergency medical
12 services personnel to reverse opioid overdoses; and

13
14 WHEREAS, opioid antagonists have no psychoactive effects
15 and do not have any potential for abuse, and first responders
16 and persons with no medical training can learn to administer
17 opioid antagonists safely; and

19 WHEREAS, research has shown that the increased availability
20 of opioid antagonists does not encourage people to use more
21 drugs or engage in riskier behavior; and

23 WHEREAS, under section 34-16.2, Revised Ordinances of
24 Honolulu, various businesses that sell or serve liquor are
25 required to maintain two doses of naloxone on their premises;

28 WHEREAS, placing naloxone doses in every public school
29 classroom can help to prevent deaths caused by accidental opioid
30 overdoses; now, therefore,

32 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second
33 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the

1 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of
2 Education is urged to supply all classrooms with Narcan or
3 another type of naloxone by September 1, 2024; and

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
6 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of
7 Education and the Chairperson of the Board of Education.
