## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM TO SUPPORT THE CREATION OF THE HAWAII INNOVATION ALLIANCE THAT WAS RECOMMENDED BY THE DUAL USE REPORT AND TO SUPPORT THE OTHER RECOMMENDATIONS WITHIN THE REPORT TO GROW THE STATE'S INNOVATION SECTOR.

WHEREAS, the State has consistently struggled to create a 1 2 sustainable and successful innovation economy; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism (DBEDT) submitted the Dual Use Report on the Dual 5 Use Technology Task Force on December 8, 2023, pursuant to 6 7 Act 121, Session Laws of Hawaii 2021; and 8 9 WHEREAS, dual use refers to technologies that can be used 10 for peaceful and military aims; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the State's businesses are in an exceptional 13 position to take advantage of the strong presence of the military in the State and the research conducted on its behalf; 14 15 and 16 17 WHEREAS, technologies developed for military use have been utilized by businesses in the past with extraordinary success, 18 and these technologies have the potential to significantly 19 20 contribute to the State's economic recovery and subsequently decrease its reliance on tourism; and 21 22 WHEREAS, DBEDT's Dual Use Report recommends: 23 24 25 (1)A specific pathway to bring a sense of unity, formality, and strength to the State's innovation 26 27 sector; 28 To build upon the numerous existing state and federal 29 (2) 30 investments under the State's Small Business



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Association, University of Hawaii, Pacific Asian 1 Center for Entrepreneurship, and the Hawaii Technology 2 Development Corporation; 3 4 (3) 5 To focus investments by ensuring funding is based on strategic and targeted outcomes; 6 7 (4) To focus on business financial sustainability through 8 encouraging and supporting the businesses that follow 9 a model for long-term financial self-sustainability 10 without a reliance on government grants; and 11 12 The proper use of public funds, to be measured through 13 (5) metrics that show a combination of impact and 14 15 accountability; and 16 WHEREAS, the Dual Use Report's suggested establishment of 17 the Hawaii Innovation Alliance (HIA) could serve as the unifying 18 brand for service providers to the innovation ecosystem in the 19 20 State, offering innovators a unified single source of support throughout the entire lifecycle of their business; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, any government, nonprofit, or for-profit service providers that offer programs or services would be offered 24 through the HIA website; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, the HIA would employ a community of Innovation 28 Sherpas to serve as personal guides to any dual use business 29 that needs assistance connecting with HIA services; and 30 31 WHEREAS, by pairing each small business with a dedicated Innovation Sherpa, the Sherpa builds a long-term relationship 32 with the business, deepening their understanding of the 33 opportunities and challenges unique to the business, and 34 35 enabling the Sherpa to better align support resources at the 36 appropriate time; now, therefore, 37 38 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second 39 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 40 Business, Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to 41 42 support the creation of the Hawaii Innovation Alliance that was



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1 recommended by the Dual Use Report and to support the other 2 recommendations within the report to grow the State's innovation 3 sector; and 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 5 6 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism and 7 the Chief Executive Officer of the Pacific Impact Zone, 8 9 10 11 OFFERED BY:
