## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY TO FURTHER ASSIST MAUI WILDFIRE VICTIMS BY AMENDING ITS REQUIREMENTS UNDER THE DIRECT LEASE PROGRAM TO REQUIRE THAT PROPERTIES QUALIFYING FOR THE PROGRAM AND USED BY LAHAINA RESIDENTS AS TEMPORARY HOUSING BE WITHIN TWENTY MILES OF LAHAINA, RATHER THAN WITHIN FORTY MILES.

1	WHEREAS, under the federal Direct Lease program, the
2	Federal Emergency Management Agency has been leasing ready-to-
3	occupy residential properties for use as temporary housing for
4	families displaced by the Maui wildfires; and
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6	WHEREAS, one requirement of the program is that each
7	eligible residential property be located within forty miles of
8	Lahaina, Maui; and
9	
10	WHEREAS, it appears that the forty-mile distance was
11	determined according to a method described in the FEMA Direct
12	Housing Guide, July 2021, which states:
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14	"Additionally, the reasonable commuting distance will be
15	established by the JFO-IA-Direct Housing during applicant
16	matching, which is the 'Mean Travel Time to Work,' as
17	determined by the most recent U.S. Census Bureau
18 19	QuickFacts. This figure will be doubled to produce the
19 20	number of miles to be used as a search radius for available housing resources from the affected area. When the terrain
20	of the affected area presents unusual impacts on travel
22	distance (e.g., mountainous terrain), consult with HQ-IA-
23	Direct Housing and RAD to establish a more accurate measure
24	of reasonable commuting distance."

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27	WHEREAS, according to the United States Census Bureau
28	QuickFacts for Lahaina census-designated place, "mean travel

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time to work (minutes), workers age 16 years+, 2018-2022" was 1 2 18.8 minutes; and 3 WHEREAS, current morning and late afternoon travel time 4 from Maui Lani and other locations that are far outside Lahaina, 5 but within the forty-mile distance, can exceed one hour and have 6 been growing longer due to traffic from increased tourism and 7 trucks hauling fire debris, with daily traffic standstills 8 9 becoming inevitable; and 10 WHEREAS, instead of merely experiencing doubled commute 11 times, Lahaina wildfire victims participating in the Direct 12 13 Lease program are facing commute times of triple or quadruple their commute times before the disaster; and 14 15 WHEREAS, businesses of Lahaina and the surrounding areas 16 17 have lost workers due to long commutes from their temporary 18 residences to work; and 19 WHEREAS, keeping Lahaina residents in Lahaina is critical 20 for community preservation; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, due to the unique mountains and limited roadways of Maui, which "presents an unusual impact on travel distance," 24 25 the Federal Emergency Management Agency should decrease the distance for eligible residential properties of the Direct Lease 26 program to allow wildfire victims to continue living in Lahaina 27 or close to Lahaina; now, therefore, 28 29 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 31 32 House of Representatives concurring, that the Federal Emergency 33 Management Agency is requested to amend its requirements under 34 the Direct Lease program for Maui wildfire victims to require that properties qualifying for the program be within twenty 35 36 miles of Lahaina, rather than within forty miles; and 37
