BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Business, 1 2 Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to submit a copy of its study, including findings and recommendations and any 3 proposed legislation to the Governor and Legislature no later 4 than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session 5 of 2025; and 6 7 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon completion of the 9 statewide disparity study, the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to post the study on its 10 website so that it is available and readily accessible to the 11 public; and 12 13 14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT within one year of the completion of the statewide disparity study, the Department of 15 Business, Economic Development, and Tourism is requested to: 16 17 18 (1)Provide goals for the equitable participation of 19 woman-owned businesses and minority-owned businesses in the performance of state contracts to the extent 20 that any disparity is revealed by the study; 21 22 23 (2) Establish procedures to: 24 25 (A) Ensure that woman-owned businesses and minorityowned businesses are provided the opportunity to 26 27 participate equitably in the performance of state contracts; and 28 29 30 (B) Assist in identifying those state contracts for which woman-owned businesses and minority-owned 31 businesses may best bid to achieve the goals 32 33 described in paragraph (1); 34 35 (3) Provide for the certification and decertification of woman-owned businesses and minority-owned businesses 36 and maintain a current list of certified woman-owned 37 38 businesses and minority-owned businesses; and 39 40 (4) Collect statistical data concerning the actual participation of woman-owned businesses and minority-41 owned businesses in state contracting; and 42
