SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF LATER SCHOOL START TIMES.

1 WHEREAS, the American Academy of Pediatrics recommends that the first school bell ring no earlier than 8:30 a.m. nationwide; 2 3 and 4 5 WHEREAS, early school start times are associated with students sleeping less, irritability and fatigue, and difficulty 6 paying attention in class, leading to poor academic performance; 7 8 and 9 10 WHEREAS, all but five public high schools in the State 11 begin their school days before 8:30 a.m.; now, therefore, 12 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2024, the 14 House of Representatives concurring, that the Department of 15 Education is requested to conduct a study of the implementation 16 of later school start times to commence no earlier than 8:30 17 18 a.m. and the impact on student health and wellness; and 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study is requested to 20 21 include public elementary, middle, and high schools; provided that each school maintain the minimum instructional time 22 23 requirements under section 302A-251, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study is also requested to 26 27 consider state provided school bus and school meal schedules for public schools to align with the later school start times; and 28 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is requested to submit a report on its study, including any 31 proposed legislation, to the Legislature, no later than twenty 32 days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2025; and 33
